






From the Desk of Chris Ludwa

A Look Back, A Look Ahead

It's hard to imagine that nearly three full years have flown by since I began this position in August of 2014, or frankly that I am departing so soon. As I said in my announcement, I hadn't really planned on leaving and was having a grand time living into this role as Music Director of both Ensemble and Chancel Choir, despite its rigorous two-evening-a-week commitment. But sometimes God flings open a door you didn't even know was there, and nudges you through it. So off I go, knowing that I have served God and this church to the best of my ability, and as the Boy Scouts say, "Perhaps left it a little better than I found it." And I found it in great condition, if undergoing some growing pains. As I think about what we've done together, here is that which springs to mind.

- A concert series that ranged from featuring our own talented singers and instrumentalists to nationally renowned groups. Each of these was carefully curated and prepared to create a spiritually moving experience that transcended the Christian experience and spoke to a human one. In each of these, we had guests in our "home" who had an encounter with God, even if they didn't call it that.
- The opportunity to continue the work of my predecessors in drawing on numerous musical styles that included global, rock, folk, gospel, classical, romantic, and more. While everyone has their favorite style, I felt fortunate to be at a church where it was all embraced and where parishioners were aware that it "wasn't all about THEIR experience, but about OURS."
- The joy of getting to work with such a wonderful music staff in Thaddeus, Pat, Amanda, and Marcia. The truly
 collaborative nature of our music-making reflected the ideals of good church- where every idea has validity and is
 honored. Plus, I loved worship planning with Hamilton and Susi each week, where the creative process would flow.
- A friendship and colleagueship with Bob Brandt, the Lead Custodian and my 4th floor suite-mate. An avid musician as well, he and I have had numerous discussions on all matter of topics, and I appreciate the way he stewards this building.
- Numerous recordings and video-recordings that accurately reflect the live experience so many have had with us in worship, thanks largely in part to Bruce Gigax and Ted Rodenborn for their generous donation of time and talent to capture the quality of music here at Federated.
- A special shout-out goes to Nancy Isham, who has spent hours upon hours ensuring that the music library is updated, whose more than 2,000 titles is an incredible resource.
- And to the choirs of Federated, whose dedication to the worship experience through hundreds of rehearsals speaks volumes about their own spiritual walk and their dedication to God through use of their talent. Perhaps ironically, THEY are the unsung heroes of this place, along with so many others here, who keep the church alive. Not only do
 - they sing the notes, they repeat them until nuanced, they slave away at the words, they perfect the pronunciation (except R's), they work on dynamics, and above all, they try to reflect upon what they are singing so it is sincere and heartfelt.

Church Council News

Church Council's May meeting began with prayers and an update on Rev. Throckmorton's health. As of this writing, we are pleased he is out of the hospital and recovering slowly but steadily. We did a round in which each council member described a highlight memory of their experiences at Federated. Not surprisingly, many of the shared memories included a sermon by Hamilton that held a special personal meaning. What is your special memory at Federated?

Chris Ludwa let us know that with a heavy heart because of his love for the choir and congregants at Federated, he would be leaving his position as director of music effective June 4 in order to take a professorship with Kalamazoo College. We are sad to lose Chris and all of his energy, commitment and talent, but wish him well in his new position that will afford him a rich new opportunity. Council sent a special thanks to Chris for the performance of A Masterwork in Art and Music at the April 23 service.

Preparations were discussed for the Congregational Meeting on May 7 to vote on the three planned projects within the capital campaign that are budgeted at more than \$100,000. We are delighted by the affirmative vote by the congregation.

We received an update on the Bainbridge Township Zoning Appeals Board meeting in April where we asked for a variance to host the YMCA Day Camp this summer at the Family Life Center (FLC). The Board postponed a decision until May and the YMCA is trying to make changes in their format that will accommodate neighbors who fear the noise would be a disturbance. This holds a significance for Federated beyond the YMCA request, as we want to be good neighbors, but also want to fully use our property for the many activities held at the FLC for the benefit of our congregation and the larger community.

Council sent a thank you to the Trinkets and Treasures volunteers, who raised a record \$25,000 this year. What a fabulous event for both the money raised and the sense of community created. It was also noted that you could walk into FLC the day after the event and never know the whirlwind of activity that occurred thanks to the tremendous team effort of staff and volunteers to clean up.

Amy Eugene attended the ALICE certification training. We expect to expand this training to others to ensure we provide a safe and secure environment for worship in addition to being welcoming to all who wish to join us.

our next Director of Music Ministries. We are planning for the interviews to take place over the summer with a new director in place by September.




