From the Desk of Hamilton

Church Council News

Council enthusiastically affirmed Chris Bednar to serve on the Human Resources Committee, and Laura Taylor for the Stewardship Committee. Federated has great need of willing volunteers to fill many roles in God's work. We are so grateful to Chris and Laura for their willing spirits and energy. If you are moved to volunteer or know someone who might, please let me know. We have roles for all, and all time and talents are welcome.

Several requests have arisen to fly other flags alongside the rainbow flag in front of Federated. Council approved a procedure for the Senior Director of Operations to efficiently review timely requests and approve them so that other flags representing our values can be flown for appropriate occasions, accompanied by information about the purpose or cause represented by the flag. This should provide opportunities for us to continue displaying our extravagant welcome and provide messages that embrace our community and the values we embody.

Great progress has been made on the Rejoice & Renew campaign with more than \$1.8 million raised. We are looking forward to Commitment Sunday on August 27, when all congregants who haven't already been contacted to pledge will have the opportunity.

Council reviewed the upcoming plans for further congregational discernment of Open and Affirming. Representatives of the commissions met again on August 13 to firm up plans for the fall weekly services, activities and lectures leading to up to celebration of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation.

The Director of Music Ministries search is moving along with a lead candidate participating in an audition and Q&A with the choir on August 1. In other music related changes, at the request of Florence Olson, the Olson Bell Choir was renamed the Federated Bell Choir in recognition of the expanding donations to sustain this group in addition to the original very generous memorial gift by the Olson family.

Amy Eugene, Senior Director of Operations, provided a thorough report on the current activities and finances of Federated. It is notable that in July, a typically slow month in the church calendar, we hosted over 250 meetings and activities requiring staff support at our two facilities. Federated is alive and thriving. Finances also remain healthy with income ahead of expenses year to date through June by more than \$133,000. We normally enter the summer months ahead on revenue due to seasonal giving, but this year is especially strong.

The next Council meeting will be on September 5 at 7:00 pm in the Lounge.

Other dates of note are Rejoice & Renew Commitment Sunday on August 27 and Rally Day on September 10.

Social Justice and Advocacy Ministry - HOLA

On August 6, 2017, Federated's Social Justice and Advocacy Ministry (SJAM) learned about current issues for immigrants from Veronica Dahlberg, Executive Director of HOLA. HOLA is a small, grassroots Latino organization in NE Ohio that focuses on advocacy, community organizing and civic engagement. HOLA works with immigrants to educate them about their rights and responsibilities. With a staff of one and a group of committed volunteers they have undertaken activities such as workshops on how to become a U.S. citizen, voter registration, leadership development and classes for entrepreneurs. The most exciting thing is their plan to have a building of their own in Painesville, which will include a commercial kitchen to help incubate small businesses in the food industry. They have secured initial funding.

For the past decade, HOLA has been involved with undocumented immigrants facing deportation as a result of our broken immigration system. HOLA volunteers meet with government officials to provide education and dialogue. They accompany immigrants to check-ins with the Immigration and Customs Enforcement Agency (ICE) and court hearings. HOLA supports families separated by deportation.

We learned that:

• The number of visas issued for farm workers nationally is at a mere 60,000, while U.S. farmers have a need for 2 million farm laborers.

• In the past, farm workers would come every year from spring to fall and return home to Mexico each winter. Now this is no longer possible. For one thing, it interrupted school for the children. Some of the people currently being deported are deemed ineligible for citizenship because ICE is going back to a border crossing from 20 years ago and retrospectively deeming the voluntary return to Mexico a "deportation." This then rules out any legal remedy to their undocumented status.

• ICE has wide discretion about who is deported. Founded in 2003 in response to the World Trade Center bombing, their mission is "to promote homeland security and public safety through the criminal and civil enforcement of federal laws governing border control, customs, trade and immigration." While ICE's mission has not changed with the new administration, how the mission is being interpreted and applied has changed drastically. It is hard to see how deporting, hardworking, family breadwinners advances this mission.

• Those deported are dropped off in one of the most crime ridden cities in Mexico (Laredo). They arrive at midnight where predators are waiting to rob and kidnap them. Family members scramble to both buy the airline ticket for the person being deported, and several thousand dollars to pay the thieves/kidnappers/crooks upon landing in Laredo. This is intentional.

Currently HOLA has been at the forefront of advocating for undocumented immigrants facing deportation. Under the current administration, immigrants who have been here for decades, checking in regularly with authorities, working, owning businesses, raising families and contributing to their communities are now being deported. It is having a negative impact on families, communities and businesses. Two large, generations old, nurseries in Lake County have closed due to lack of workers. Other businesses are struggling in the face of losing long time, valued, skilled workers.

We as a country have failed to fix our broken immigration system. Although many politicians have given immigration reform and a path to citizenship lip service, our failure to do so is now on full display.

Parish Nurse Update—Second Nurse Wanted

Did you know that the Federated Church sponsors a Parish Nurse Clinic at St. Paul's UCC, our sister church on the near West Side? And that it simply would not exist without the commitment of generous Federated members. This commitment is evidenced by food for the St. Paul's pantry, clothes and small household goods for their second-hand closet, lifters and drivers to transport the donations, skilled fix-it folks to do repairs and maintain the humble building, school supplies and backpacks in August, and a part-time volunteer retired nurse (me!) to purchase and hand out basic personal hygiene, underwear, and baby supplies two mornings a week.

What would be helpful are monetary donations to our designated line item fund (used for supplies) and, perhaps, a second retired nurse to volunteer two to four Friday mornings a month (9:30 to approximately 11:45). The church is closed on Mondays and my availability is on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. Another nurse, supplied by Care Alliance, comes on Thursdays. Folks, this is a very rewarding ministry, especially for nurses who feel called to lend a friendly "hand up" to those who are really struggling.

This has been one of the most gratifying and eye-opening experiences of my nursing life. And as a volunteer, you will have flexibility to go on your vacations and/or trade with me for a Tuesday or Wednesday when needed and possible. You might want to come with me one day just to see if this is a fit for you, and if you think you would like to make this a part of your schedule, you will be thoroughly oriented. A JustHope-Federated PartnerTrip to Chacraseca, Nicaragua

November 12-19

JustHope PartnerTrips are focused more on growing relationships than on accomplishing projects. Projects are understood and incorporated into PartnerTrips as a means of engaging with global partners in their context, but the trips are structured to facilitate encounter, dialogue, and cultural immersion as the primary objectives. JustHope's mission is to create long-term global partnerships that are committed to combating extreme poverty and increasing global understanding.

Sermon series for September and October: The Seven Solae

As many of you know, October 31, 2017 marks the 500th anniversary of the day that Martin Luther nailed his 95 thesis against the Catholic Church up on the church door in Wittenberg. Although church reformation had been on the hearts and minds of many for years before that, and much had been written and said, it was this action by Luther that marked the beginning of the reformation, and the birth of the Protestant Church.

The early reformers put forth three foundational principles of reformation known as the "Solae." **Sola Scriptura** (only scripture, not tradition), **Sola Gratia**, (only grace, not merit), **Sola Fides** (only faith, not works). Each was intended to represent an important distinction of the Reformers' beliefs compared with Catholic doctrine.

By the middle of the 20th Century, it became common to see the original list of three Solae increased to five. The additions were **Solus Christus** (Christ as only mediator between God and human) and **Soli Deo gloria** (glory to God alone).

More recently, certain Anglican scholars have suggested that there should be a further two additional Solae on the list, bringing the total to seven: **Sola ecclesia** (the Church alone) and **Sola caritas** (charitable love alone).

We will be celebrating Reformation Sunday on October 29. For the seven Sundays before then, beginning with Rally Day, September 10, and running through Sunday, October 22, we will be using one of these Solae each week, along with a Lectionary scripture reading, as a theme for our worship services.
