

JOURNEY TO GENEROSITY: STEWARDSHIP 2017


A Stewardship Campaign right on the heels of a Capital Campaign?! You bet!

From the Desk of Hamilton

Dear Friends,

Money is a funny subject in the church. Not funny ha-ha, of course. Money is funny because it stirs things up in us. One of the complaints I've heard most when people talk about a church they've disliked is: "They talk too much about money. We don't come to church to be badgered about money." We come to church, we think, to pray, to hear about God, to grow in the Spirit. Money too easily dominates the rest of life. Don't let it get out of control here.

I get that, I really do. In the church, I love, more than anything, to engage people theologically. I love to toss around ideas and think about God and immerse ourselves in the Bible. I love to find ways to respond to God and enhance our mission in the world. If the subject of money becomes too predominant, I begin to feel antsy, and to think we're getting away from what's central. I'm tempted to deal with the money part as guickly and unobtrusively as possible.

So it came as something of a shock to me when I learned that Jesus talks more about money than he does about any other subject. Let me say it again: Jesus talks more about money than about heaven and hell, more even than he talks about love. Eleven of his 39 parables talk about money and possessions. If you're like me, this is hard to believe. Nevertheless, it's true.

And it's true because Jesus knew that, if we're to have a deep and lively faith, all that we have and all that we are need to be directed to God. With a dynamic faith our whole lives are given to God. With a vibrant faith, we don't cling to what God has given us. We give it away. We share it generously. When we don't share extravagantly, something crucial is missing. Stingy giving is a sign of stingy faith.

All of which is to give some context to this season in Federated's life. Having spent a good deal of energy in the last four months inviting gifts to our Rejoice and Renew Capital Campaign, now, with no real break, we enter the season in which we focus on stewardship. During the month of October, we will be inviting our pledges for the ministry and mission of Federated in 2018. We will be inviting ourselves to follow the way of Jesus and to be on the journey to generosity.

As an upcoming stewardship bulletin insert notes, "we certainly know that investing money in the work of ministry and mission on behalf of others improves the quality of life in our community. It also directly benefits us with a sense of purpose, overall well-being, and being a part of something that is larger than ourselves. It is good for us!"

Church Council News

Church Council met September 5th. Here are highlights from the meeting.

Our Rejoice & Renew Capital Campaign brings us to 2.45 million dollars of pledge commitments and counting! Contributions and commitments continue to grow, making it possible to return Federated's ministering facilities to strong working order. As the campaign draws to a close, a phone-a-thon on Tuesday evening, 9/26 will rally all congregants to actively participate.

Cross-commission sessions continue the second Sunday of alternating months. Councilors, chairs, and representatives from each of our five commissions are encouraged to attend this 50-minute meeting 10:00-10:50 am, designed to integrate and coordinate programming and messaging across commissions. Together, we are developing action plans to make Federated's Open and Affirming commitment to diversity evident in all we do and say. You can expect to see a deliberate increase in sensitivities, advocacies, and education regarding the needs and rights of diverse populations.

At the time of this writing and after a responsible and thorough search process, a new Music Director has been selected to ensure a vibrant music ministry at Federated! As Josh Konow joins us in mid October, please make a deliberate effort to introduce yourselves and affirm his welcome.

Our Senior Director of Operations, Amy Eugene, presented a detailed budget report highlighting a need to decrease our overhead costs. To minimize spending, how might our church gradually rely more on all of us and less on custodial staff for some of the set up, clean up, and optimized scheduling of facilities?

The YMCA held a successful summer camp at our Family Life Center (FLC). They will be requesting from the Bainbridge Township Zoning Board of Appeals the opportunity to expand to another summer camp in 2018 as well as a series of Schools Out Fun Days at our FLC to provide wholesome childcare during the school year as "mini camp days" on regularly scheduled days off from schools.

Council is researching expanded utilization of the FLC as an important contributing force to our future.

Next Church Council meeting will be Tuesday, October 3 at 7:00 in the Lounge.

The October film, "For the Bible Tells Me So" is the winner of the Audience Award for Best Documentary at the Seattle International Film Festival. Dan Karslake's provocative, entertaining documentary brilliantly reconciles homosexuality and Biblical scripture, and in the process reveals that church-sanctioned anti-gay bias is based solely upon a significant (and often malicious) misinterpretation of the Bible. Through the experience of five very normal, very Christian, very American families - including those of former House Majority Leader Richard Gephardt and Episcopalian Bishop Gene Robinson - we discover how insightful people of faith handle the realization of having a gay child. With commentary by such respected voices as Bishop Desmond Tutu, Harvard's Peter Gomes, Orthodox Rabbi Steve Greenberg and Reverend Jimmy Creech, "For the Bible Tells Me So" offers healing, clarity and understanding to anyone caught in the crosshairs of scripture and sexual identity.
