Imagine the look of awe on a young child's face as he sees Baby Jesus lying in his mother's arms... or the stirring in young parents' hearts as they introduce their children to the true meaning of Christmas... or hundreds of people passing through the Family Life Center to journey to Bethlehem. Imagine stepping away from the stress of holiday preparations – away from the mall, the wrapping, the decorating, the spending – and taking a step back in time to relive the birth of Christ...

On December 3, Federated Church will present its third annual *Search for the Christ Child*, an interactive journey to Bethlehem. This presentation will be not only for our own church family. We'll throw our doors open and invite the community to join us on the journey to celebrate the birth of Christ.

Visitors will be welcomed at the Camelback Inn where the census will be taken and then they are served light refreshments. After a short wait, small groups will travel together, led by Shepherd Guides who tell of the birth of a long awaited King, the Son of God. On a journey back in time, travelers encounter angels, shepherds, and live animals during their search for the child. They seek help from wise men, stop at King Herod's Palace and pass through a bustling marketplace. Soon, they realize that they will see the face of God at the end of this journey. Ultimately, travelers arrive at the nativity. Here, in the stable, this tiny baby is the hope of the world.

## **From the Desk of Hamilton**

#### Dear Friends,

A church member whose children have recently departed for college said to me recently that she hadn't anticipated such a sense of loss when they left home. There was a palpable sense of grief in her as she mentioned this. I could vividly remember my own sense of loss when our children went to college, as well. Something crucial seemed to have vanished. Their departure left a huge hole in Mary's and my life.

At the same time, though, those losses have yielded some wonderful gains. As first one son and then the other left, Mary and I grieved. But we also rejoiced at the young adults they were becoming. We could see them maturing and growing and developing a sense of their own agency in the world. New families and careers took the place of their childhood

dependence. We could see their generosity and big hearts blossom. We could see new gifts they were offering to the world. Along with the losses that have inevitably arisen along the way, we have seen their own initiative and a new flowering.

This is not unlike what we see in the church at large, and at Federated in particular. Things have changed a great deal over the years. People we've known and loved have died or moved on to other things. Programs that have mattered to us have vanished. Initiatives that we've valued have become dormant. And all this may yield a certain amount of sadness.

At the same time, God is always doing something new in our midst, and holy love leaves its stamp on us in ever new and fresh ways. As I look back on this fall season, I see a new Director of Music Ministries, Joshua Konow, joining us and bringing new ideas and enthusiasms. I see a committed response to the plea for hurricane relief, as 46 buckets of cleaning supplies were collected to send to Texas, Florida, and Puerto Rico. I see an extraordinarily successful Rejoice and Renew capital campaign. I see a continued passion for demonstrating to the world that God welcomes all. God's energy bubbles up in new ways. Holy freshness renews and invigorates us.

As we look ahead, we will soon begin to see the fruits of that capital campaign as our buildings are spruced up and repaired in the necessary ways. We will continue to worship and form faith and create community and serve the world beyond us in life-giving ways. We will continue to be the church of Jesus Christ, conveying love and embrace in manifold ways.

As we come to this season of Thanksgiving, I invite us to be ever mindful of the exquisite blessings we have all received. Food and housing, family and friends, and above all this fine and lively church will continue to nourish us.

And it is God who has been so generous to us. So may we continue to respond to that grace with love poured out to each other and the wider world. We are indeed blessed to be a blessing. Thanks be to God!

## **Church Council News**

Church Council received a final report on the Rejoice and Renew Capital Campaign. We are so thankful for the many hours of hard work by volunteers and staff, and the generous response by the congregation resulting in \$2,852,631 raised to date, with \$868,000 cash in hand. As donations become available, Amy Eugene will work with the Finance Committee, Properties Committee, and Worship and Music Commission to begin projects funded by this campaign according to priorities set by Council. A full report will be provided at the 2017 Annual Meeting on February 11, 2018, and Council will update the congregation regularly on progress.

The YMCA has contracted once again to use the Family Life Center in the summer months for a youth day camp, and we obtained approval from the Bainbridge Zoning Board. The program will be expanded to include days in which the Chagrin Schools are off for teacher work days, etc.

Council voted to call a Properties Feasibility Task Force to recommend potential future use for all three of our properties with the aim of reporting back to Council in time for the 2017 Annual Meeting on February 11, 2018. Robin Harbage will chair the task force which will reach out to the congregation, commissions, committees and staff for input.

The Properties Committee reported on parking and will share a plan for alternate parking lots during construction at the Intermediate School. The main lot will be reserved first for handicapped, elderly and then visitors. *See page 5 or fedchurch.org/parking for more information.* 

Year-to-date financials are trending above for income and below for expenses. We project a positive operating budget on December 31, 2017. Council approved a recommendation of the Finance Committee to authorize the hiring of a part time financial administrative person to report to the Senior Director of Operations. The position will be about 15-20 hours per week.

The Spiritual Formation Commission continues to search for appropriate Bible study around our Open and Affirming (ONA) designation. The Commission suggested we participate in the Transgender Day of Remembrance and ring the bell on November 20 as an opportunity for our ONA congregation to honor our trans neighbors—here and abroad—who lost their lives in the past year to violence and suicide. It was also discussed that we should ring the bell for those lost in the Las Vegas tragedy.

The next Church Council meeting will be November 7.

## Social Justice and Advocacy Ministry (SJAM) Team News and Opportunities to Join in

On October 15 Hamilton, Susi, Dan Kershner, Carolyn Cunningham, and Judy Kramer attended a sanctuary breakfast at Forest Hill Presbyterian Church, along with representatives from other congregations. Our purpose for attending was both to support Forest Hill as a sanctuary church and to learn from their experience. We listened to prayers and introductions from their pastor, Rev. John Lentz, and learned from members how FHC became a sanctuary church, and how this impacted their congregation and the surrounding community. We then heard from Leonor Garcia, the woman who is their guest being offered sanctuary in their church. She told her own heart-rending story about her life before she came to FHC, and after.



We learned more about the status of immigration legislation, DACA and the dreamers, and the possibility of Cleveland Heights becoming a sanctuary city. We were given information about how other faith communities can offer sanctuary or support the sanctuary movement, for example: joining in partnership with other congregations, supporting FHC or starting advocacy groups in their own congregations.

The Social Justice Advocacy Ministry Team is committed to educating ourselves and our church in a variety of areas, including immigration. One opportunity to engage in this with us is to attend our November movie night (see below). We invite everyone from Federated Church and the larger community to join together for an evening of learning, stimulating conversation, and exploring the issues of our times. We will watch a movie, and then engage in discussion about it, centering around the questions that keep coming: "What is God calling us to do? What is God asking of us? How will we respond?"
