May the spirit of Christmas be upon you!

A tradition of giving beyond our walls, spanning more than five decades is once again at Federated Church's door step. The Mission and Service Commission has prayerfully considered numerous applications for this year's Christmas Eve Offering and the selection has been made. It is never an easy process and the decision is made with a great deal of respect for the needs placed before the commission. This year we celebrate Hiram Farm, an agricultural setting for adults with developmental disabilities, with emphasis on adults on the autism spectrum.

This year's offering will go to construct an addition to the farmhouse. This addition will provide enough programing space to serve an additional 19 farmers by the end of 2018. This one time investment will make it possible for Hiram Farm to serve 50 adults with significant developmental disabilities annually for many decades to come. Farmers see, feel and taste the fruits of their labor. The animals, crops and craftworks that the farmers produce provide them with a source of income; the resulting sense of ownership, accomplishment and self-worth goes beyond the paycheck.

Our financial gifts to this project are only the beginning; Hiram Farm offers many opportunities to engage with the farmers, volunteering for a few hours, a day or for a week-long overnight summer session.

Federated Church members are invited to tour the Hiram Farm and to meet the wonderful staff and farmers and see first-hand how Hiram Farm changes lives forever. More information can be found on their website at hiramfarm.org

From the Desk of Hamilton

Dear Friends,

On a recent weekend, the Federated Church Council held a retreat at our Family Life Center. It gave us a chance to step back from the day-to-day busy-ness that consumes so many of us. We took the time to listen to the voice of God in scripture, remembering that God has searched and known each of us, but also that God has searched and known this church (Psalm 139). We reflected on the richness of the life we've been given and the opportunities that have been placed before us. We reconnected with each other and deepened our relationships. It was a welcome gift.

As we reflected on life here at Federated, we were moved to remember that we have been appointed by God to care, to serve, and to seek. One of our primary tasks, as Christians, is to share in a community whose people give themselves to each other, trust each other, and care for each other. If members and staff don't sense an underlying warmth to church life, all vitality seeps away. For members and friends, the church then is just one more lifeless organization; for staff, it's no more than a dull workplace. When care bursts into flame, then lonely people find companionship, hurting people find a balm for their pain, grieving people find hope in their loss. Care, from the Latin word for love, is what sustains people in their pain and galvanizes them for deeds of love. We're called to care.

At the retreat, we also came to see again that we are here to serve. When we feel sustained by the richness of a caring church, we are empowered to share that love with others beyond our walls. We serve with and for people at Chagrin Falls Park and St. Paul's Church. We serve with and for people who have historically not found a home in any church. We serve with and for much poorer communities in Nicaragua and South Africa. We're called to serve.

And finally, we are called to seek. On our own, none of us has all the resources we need for a full and whole life. A mysterious God awaits our active seeking. A glorious God looks forward to being found. Worship and faith formation are primary tools for actively engaging the God who is always just beyond our reach. Our Council was reminded that an active engagement with the Holy One is a crucial part of a rich and full life.

As the season of Advent begins on December 3, together as a church we are reminded that God is always coming toward us. That is the meaning of the word "advent": "coming." God is coming close, and touching our lives, and filling our empty places. Again and again in scripture, the promise is that Christ is coming. One of Jesus' name is "Emmanuel": God with us. As we care and serve and seek, this Advent, may we be filled with a holy glory, one that restores us and fills us and sends us forth

to serve joyfully and with a radiant energy.

Church Council News

Church Council held its monthly meeting on November 7. It is important for Council to handle monthly responsibilities, but we also understand our role to provide strategic direction for the church. Mindful of this, we have formed a Properties Feasibility Task Force to collect input from the congregation and staff, and formulate plans for best utilizing our physical resources to achieve the mission of Federated. Input is sought from all stakeholders within the church and your feedback is welcome through either an email to FederatedPropertiesTaskForce@gmail.com or a note placed in the mailbox of the Moderator in the church office. This is a congregational church, so your input is critical.

Council also devoted time to a retreat at the Family Life Center on November 10-11 to step back from operational issues and concentrate on longer term ideas to ensure Federated thrives, fulfills our mission and serves the Lord. Look for updates in future issues of the SPIRE and at the Annual Meeting on February 11.

The current Council is short two members, as the Clerk and Administrative Counselor positions are vacant. As with all volunteer work of the church, please open your heart to serving your church if called. All positions within the church leadership play an important part in fulfilling God's calling and the church does not succeed without you.

After a very successful capital campaign, we are working hard on the Stewardship campaign to ensure the programs of the church and staffing can be sustained and grow. Pledges reported as of the Council meeting were \$698,000, which is \$3,000 less than had been pledged by the same group of congregants last year. Council will begin making calls in mid-November to members who pledged last year but have not yet pledged this year. It is essential for planning staff and programming, that we have an accurate picture of our expected resources. As good stewards, we can't budget more than your committed giving to fund our programs and mission.

Work is progressing on receiving bids and setting timelines for organ and building work funded by the Rejoice & Renew Capital Campaign. Council will receive updates at the next meeting on December 5, and report that progress to the congregation. Council also received updates on the parking situation and received reports from the commissions and committees. There is a great deal of excitement and work going on around Federated. We hosted 322 events at our facilities in October! If you aren't involved in more than just our wonderful worship services, then you are missing out on great spiritual and fellowship opportunities.


Best Wishes to Bob Brandt







Mission & Service Opportunities

Parish Nurse Program

"Thank you to everyone who stopped by the table at the Mission Fair. I have noticed a big increase in donations to the PN boxes in the lobby and I am so grateful for your support."

The clinic at St. Paul's serves about 120 folks per week with counseling, referrals and basic hygiene products.
