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## Rejoice & Renew Capital Campaign Projects Update—Part 2

There are lots of projects going on around here!

The excavation outside our building and next to our driveway is for the new AC unit for our Fellowship Hall. The contractors are putting in a concrete pad and walls to shield equipment from view as required by the Chagrin Falls Architectural Review Board. This AC unit will be installed at the end of July. There are five separate units that serve our Bell Street facility: Fellowship Hall area, remainder of the first floor (Large Music Room, etc.), Sanctuary, Chapel, and Education/Office wings. The unit for the Education/Office wings will be rebuilt, not replaced, due to cost constraints. The Sanctuary and Chapel units will be replaced in August.

At the same time, the steeple repairs are currently being done. In addition, there is still work to be done on the "flat" part of the roof over the Sanctuary. The contractors will access open space above the Sanctuary ceiling through holes in the roof to add insulation – making this space "cold" instead of "warm," which will address the condensation issues. After that is done, the roof will be finished.

While all of this is going on, the general contractor is on-site every day except Tuesday. He is very responsive and tuned-in. Keith Mast is also here three days/week to answer questions. We are so grateful!

Especially as worship finishes each Sunday morning, many people stack chairs and replace hymnals so that the work

## **Church Council News**

God's still-speaking voice offering light in the darkness continues to engage the missions and ministries of Federated. In order to keep our missions and ministries fresh and responsive, Church Council continues to pursue actions in organizational development. We continue to refine our discernment processes to ensure the wise and responsible allocation of the church's resources.

June brought restructuring and refreshing of positions to serve the church even more efficiently and effectively. Our Human Resources Committee facilitated performance reviews for our ministers. Also, Council moved to create a new Properties & Events Manager position to manage the myriad details associated with hosting over 300 events per month, as well as a new bookkeeper/accounting position (rather than the external contracted service), all at no net increase to the church.

The Rejoice & Renew (R&R) Capital Campaign projects roll all across the summer months. Part of the roof is completed. You may have noticed the masonry wall outside the Fellowship Hall. The Chagrin Falls Architectural Review Board required some aesthetic enhancements regarding our new HVAC units.

Council moved that Laura Taylor continue through September in her crucial role as Capital Campaign Assistant. Laura's positivity and faith spur momentum, communication and generosity driving successful outcomes! Meanwhile, thanks to so many generous and timely cash contributions to our Capital Campaign, funds for 2018 are generating interest.

A series of visioning teams are working with Tim Lybarger, design coach, to help frame their potential ministry team's purpose, to consider community needs they will serve and resources required, and to discover ways to move Federated's mission forward. Each one connects to a sponsoring commission or to Church Council. This work expands our capacity for growth.

A subcommittee of SJAM proposed the church initiate the UCC process to be designated as a "green church." Council recognized the value of this proposal and recommended a visioning team format to frame the work.

Council designated a new task force called Reimagining the Sunday Experience (RISE) to work with our visioning team coach to discover the spiritual needs of the community and collaboratively cultivate rich worship experiences for all.

Hello generous parishioners,

With summer church services being held at the Family Life Center, I moved our donation box to the Lobby out there. The needs for summer are about the same: cooler socks (especially for men), deodorant, toothpaste, toilet paper, feminine hygiene products, body and foot powder, soap, wipes, A&D ointment, etc. All of these items can be found at Dollar Tree—everything there is one dollar and most things are nearly "full-sized."

I am thinking about starting a bus pass program, as transportation is a major issue for poor people trying to find and keep jobs. If there is some interest in contributing to this program, please indicate so on the memo line of your check by writing "Bus to Work." A one -day pass costs \$5.50 for adults, and \$2.75 for disabled folks and seniors. This pass will enable St. Paul's clients

to go to job interviews, and if there is enough support, to continue going to work. I will make sure any donations to this program will be used to buy and distribute bus passes for that purpose only.

Also, I want to thank our two very special volunteers who are substituting for me when I am on vacation. They are Bill Shaul, retired pediatrician, and Leslie Fincun, retired social worker. They have been a wonderful addition to our program, ensuring continuity when I am gone. Anybody from a health-related field would do very well in this role and would receive a full orientation before going solo. And I make sure supplies are purchased before I leave.
