What's Been Happening

The New Organ

Our organist, Marcia Snavely, received some exciting news from her contact at the TS Good Organ Company. The new Rodgers console is at the showroom and it is beautiful! So many new features - the record and playback feature by itself is a revelation. Imagine, Marcia will be able to register the prelude, record it, and then go out into the Sanctuary to hear it exactly as everyone else does.

Our old organ console has been donated to Parma-South Presbyterian Church. Tim Hemry, our organ tuner and organ maintenance person, was responsible for the transfer to Parma-South. It's been put to good use by a technician who has been with us for a long time – much better than finding its way to a landfill.

There are about 2,300 pipes in our organ and each of them had to be hand-rewired. In July, each pipe underwent tonal regulation for speech and volume. After the Sanctuary renovation is complete, the pipes will undergo a tonal finishing, or tweaking, as the pipes acclimate to the new wood and carpet surfaces in the Sanctuary.

Music is such a strong part of our identity and we are fortunate that Marcia and Joshua, our Director of Music Ministries, are leading the way through this organ project. Marcia is excited about her surgery recovery. Her cast came off at the end of August and she is already getting back in the swing of things.

A New Tractor

As you drive by the Family Life Center, if you see Jake mowing the grass with our new tractor, wave "H!" It now only takes him two full days to mow the lawn on our 40-acre property.

A New Phone System

On August 20, Federated transitioned to the new phone system. Our phone system was over 20 years old, so the staff is looking forward to the new features available. See new staff extension numbers on page 6. We all are adjusting to the new system and ask your patience and understanding during this exciting time.

Marking the Chancel

The upgrading and renovating of the Sanctuary provided our Federated Church family with the opportunity to honor those who have shaped our faith. Members came to the Sanctuary and, on the foundation of the Chancel area, used markers to write names, draw, or otherwise express their gratitude to those who have been foundational in their faith journey. There were even tributes from our far-away friends who still connect with us via Facebook. These markings will be covered with new hardwood flooring, but the names will stay as

part of the foundation of our church. Many thanks to Rev. Susi Kawolics for recommending this brilliant idea and for Paul Koepf for coordinating the logistics to make this happen.

What's Upcoming

Please note: The current project timeline has us returning to the Sanctuary on Sunday, November 4

There's been a tremendous volume of work, movement, dust, fire alarms, and crane activity happening at Bell Street! It's been exciting, hectic, noisy, and occasionally warm or downright hot! We had a very large crane in the parking lot on August 8 which was needed to move the different HVAC units. The steeple has been repaired and there is a new roof on the building. The carpenters for the new Chancel area subflooring have come and gone. They did a beautiful job accommodating our "Marking the Chancel" tribute opportunity and we are so appreciative.

Soon it will be time for the painting and new carpet installation. Three bids for carpet and painting have been reviewed and the contractors for each have been selected. The plaster/paint work in the Sanctuary is contingent upon the completion of the work in the attic and the placement of the last HVAC unit on the roof. That unit is in storage waiting for the completion of a steel structure that will support the new 15,000 pound HVAC unit and improve the structural integrity of our roof. After that is in place, the internal plaster and paint work of the Sanctuary can begin, working from the top down. Lastly, the new carpet will be installed. All of the areas one would consider part of Sunday morning worship space will receive new plaster, paint and carpet. This includes the Lobby, Fellowship Hall, Choir Room/Restrooms Hallway, Sanctuary Stairwell, Narthex, Sanctuary, Conference Room, Parents/Infant's Room and Balcony.

Our Properties Committee and capital campaign project leaders are being good stewards of the funds that have been received-to-date. They are scheduling each project as pledge payments are received and are coordinating start and completion timelines, as some of the projects are dependent upon one another. The Rejoice & Renew Capital Campaign is a three-year endeavor, so there are quite a few

projects that will be completed later in 2019 and 2020, like repaving the parking lot, new Conference Room chairs, and audio/visual and restroom upgrades. Using various gifts of support, we are – *together* – making all of these projects possible. That support continues to come in all shapes and sizes: praying, volunteering, leading, financially committing. *Each of them* is just as important as the other and our church is blessed to be the recipient. Thanks be to God!

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Church Council News

Ephesians 4:15 "Instead, by speaking the truth with love, let's grow in every way into Christ

The August session of Church Council drew us into a common language for discerning essentials and managing our time and energy wisely. Developing clear channels for decision-making and communicating will strengthen the overall productivity and impact of our church's mission and vision.

Council's Properties Feasibility Task Force completed Phase One: determining potential use of all three of our properties (76 Bell, 102 Bell, and the Family Life Center) to make recommendations to Council. Through interviews, feedback was accumulated into a list of possibilities for optimizing the church's mission. A big "thank you" goes to Robin Harbage (convener), Lisa Buescher, Kristi Horner and Paul Koepf. Council will now form a team of staff and congregants to advance the work of discovering (among the recommendations) the options that are cost effective and that uplift the church's mission and purpose. Incorporated in that work will be an evaluation of viable scenarios for sustaining our three properties. The recommendation is to continue this study under the organizational development consultation of Tim Lybarger.

The Church's financial report revealed the good news that our Legacy Fund has continued to grow at a rate better than last year. Also, with the increased payment of the PNC loan, we are on track to retire the loan in two years! While capital campaign projects proceed at a gallant clip, a few unanticipated maintenance issues are surfacing among our three properties. So Church Council is identifying present sources for funding these critical projects.

Amy Eugene reported we can anticipate a promising hire to fill the Properties & Events Manager position. Members are encouraged to offer a warm Federated welcome to our new staff. In addition, the church shifted to contracting outside services for cleaning at the Family Life Center. That model is working so well that we will utilize the cleaning service three days per week at Bell Street.

The RISE Task Force is expanding its information-gathering phase to the whole congregation. They will present prototypes on Rally Day for your added feedback and express features that inspire. More info is available on page 5.

Indeed, God's hope for Federated grows in mysterious and marvelous ways throughout Federated!

Sermon Series for September: The Phoenix Affirmations

The vision for Federated Church this year is "Behold how they love one another." In keeping with this theme, our worship planning team has decided to offer a sermon series on The Phoenix Affirmations – a set of twelve principles based on the greatest commandment: Love God, Love Self and Love Neighbor.

The Phoenix Affirmations were created by a group of pastors, theologians and biblical scholars from many denominations to articulate a vision for what the Christian faith is called to stand for. These twelve principles fall into groups of four under the headings of the Three Great Loves identified by Jesus (Matthew 22:37-40).

A brief summary of these affirmations is as follows: *Christian Love of God* includes walking fully in the path of Jesus without denying the legitimacy of other paths; listening for God's Word, which comes in a variety of ways; celebrating the God whose glory is reflected in all of God's creation; and expressing our love in sincere and artful worship. *Christian Love of Neighbor* includes treating all as creations made in God's very image; standing with the outcast and oppressed; preserving religious freedom; and walking humbly with God. *Christian Love of Self* encompasses the belief that we, and all people, are loved beyond our wildest imaginations, for eternity; that our minds and our hearts are sacred and both serve in the pursuit of truth; that we are called to care for our bodies, taking time to enjoy the benefits of prayer, reflection, worship, and recreation in addition to work; that we are born with a meaning and purpose, a vocation and ministry that serve to strengthen and extend God's realm of love. Bethel Bible Study provides auditory and visual tools to help you establish a sound Biblical knowledge involving emphasis on key Biblical concepts and 40 professionally prepared "teaching" pictures with corresponding lessons.

From Our Environmental Justice Task Force: Plastics!

Our SJAM task force and all who attended the April movie night were blown away by *A Plastic Ocean* (available on Netflix). Here are some revelations from the movie:

The big news is that plastic never goes away. There are 8.3 billion tons of plastic in the world.

There are micro-plastics found throughout all the oceans of the world and a floating island of plastics in the Pacific Ocean the size of Texas, BUT, you may not know that sea birds and fish and other ocean animals eat the plastics which fill their stomachs and they die of starvation!

Plastic does not decompose, BUT, you may not know that the pieces of plastic become so broken up they are eaten by fish and plastic can be found in the fish we eat!

We should all bring reusable grocery bags when we shop. And we should not use plastic water bottles for anything. You may not realize the average plastic grocery bag is used for 14 minutes and the plastic water bottle for even less time!

Plastic straws and stirrers make up 7% of plastic found in the environment. You can refuse a straw when you eat out, and not use one at all!

Single-use plastic, like straws, plastic cups, plastic bags, plastic plates, forks, etc. are used only once and thrown away. These are a huge problem.

And why do we care? Why should we want to do these things to help protect the Earth? Because we are stewards of God's creation. We can be a creation-caring, creationjustice people of God. Let's all work together to do this.


Behold, See How They Love One Another

For the past year, Federated has honored the shift in participation toward community connection and action. This shift has not only involved more members being educated and taking action regarding current issues, but it has also expanded our access to the world at large and allowed the greater community to get to know us better. Various news agencies have mentioned/featured our connections to the community 23 times in the last ten months. That equates to a banner year! There may be more even that we don't know about. We are thankful that The Chagrin Valley Times, The Chagrin Solon Sun, The Geauga Maple Leaf, The Epoch Times, The UCC News, The Plain Dealer, Fox8 News and WKYC News have all taken an interest in the ministries that are important to us. One of the news articles concerned an SJAM involvement in the pilot program Sacred Conversations to End Racism (SC2ER). Bill Shaul, Sunny Doxey, Dawn Dole, Darlene Nichols and Carolyn Cunningham completed the eight-session program in conjunction with an equal number of members from a predominantly black church, the South Euclid United Church of Christ. To meet its program goal of deconstructing racism, the sessions explained the cultural basis of the Bible and the evolution of our understanding of race. After studying the weekly assignments, the group of ten met to discuss their reaction to the lesson in relation to their life experiences. According to Bill, the group dynamics lent well to this discerning process. There was a nice cross-section of ages and life experiences. The second phase of SC2ER is currently being written and is meant to train people how to be effective activists in a faithbased community. Faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead (James 2:17). And, as Hamilton stated in a sermon earlier this year, we are the ones who act out the work of faith.



While speaking with Bill recently about Federated's participation in SC2ER, it became obvious that the group's involvement fulfilled all four parts of our Church Vision. Bill, Sunny, Dawn, Darlene and Carolyn participated in a transformational ministry program on behalf of Federated that nurtured their faith and encompassed extravagant inclusion. If you have any questions about their experience with this program or the lessons they learned, they'd love to share their story. We are grateful that the UCC News shared their story with the national United Church of Christ community.


