

Today's Guest Preacher: Malcolm Himschoot

Malcolm lives in Cleveland and serves the United Church of Christ as the denomination's Minister for Ministerial Transitions. He studied urban ministry at the Iliff School of Theology, graduating with an MDiv in 2004. He was ordained in the United Church of Christ while serving the ecumenical Denver Inner

City Parish, and went on to serve churches in Minnesota and Colorado.

A widely-known transgender man and educator, his early story was made into a UCC documentary, *Call Me Malcolm*. Himschoot was the 2011 recipient of the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries' Social Prophet Award.

His volunteer work has included community organizing for responsible development, immigration reform, criminal sentencing reform, and Showing Up for Racial Justice (SURJ-Northeast Ohio). His 2017 article, "Practices of Spirit for Genderqueer and Transgender Christians" was published in *Vol. 9 of Sacred Spaces: The E-Journal of the American Association of Pastoral Counselors*.
