

### **2018 Christmas Eve Offering Recipient: HOLA Ohio**

"Jesus said, 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind'; and, 'Love your neighbor as yourself'" (Luke 10:27).

The excitement of the Christmas Season is upon us! Many services and celebrations are being planned here at Federated Church, and for the Mission and Service Commission this means serious conversations and prayerful considerations have taken place regarding our long-standing tradition of the Christmas Eve Offering.

The Mission and Service Commission received many worthy applications for the 2018 offering and after thoughtful discussions the commission chose HOLA Ohio, a community organization based in Painesville. Its mission is to empower the community it serves through education, outreach, leadership development and more. Formed in 1999 as an informal group of Latinas wanting to help agricultural workers and their families, HOLA has become a pillar of the Ohio Latino and immigrant community and works with families across the state as a go-to resource.

This nonprofit offers an array of bilingual and culturally-competent programming to attend to the needs of the Latino population. HOLA has been providing many of these services to Latinos in northeast Ohio without a reliable location. HOLA currently operates out of a small, store-front church in Painesville on an as-needed basis. But this space is not always available and not large enough. Programs have been shuffled around to local libraries, other churches and public parks. The time has come to find a fixed location for HOLA to operate.

The efforts to create a home for the HOLA Ohio Community Center have begun as they work to generate the capital needed to complete this project. HOLA has a well thought out plan to raise these funds. Presently over 42% of these funds are committed.

Our 2018 Christmas Eve Offering will be dedicated to the Educational Area, an adaptable space with moveable walls which includes a classroom and a small meeting room. This area will be used for adult and youth programming, including English as a second language classes, citizenship tutoring, workforce and entrepreneurial trainings and voter education programs.

The HOLA Ohio Hispanic Community Center will anchor economic development and entrepreneurial services for Latinos in the area. HOLA will assist and empower thousands of immigrants as they stabilize their economic and civic standing and boost the overall economic vitality of the region. Ultimately, the target population will become a reliable pool of labor for agriculture, landscaping construction and other businesses which currently confront a lack of skilled and unskilled workers.

The Mission and Service Commission is committed to the developing partnership with HOLA. It began with hosting and supporting its annual raiser at the Family Life Center last June. Now we look forward to engaging with financial and volunteer support. The commission thanks you for your prayerful consideration of the 2018 Christmas Eve Offering and invites you to join in giving generously.

What an exciting time here at Federated! Many of you will receive this issue of *The Spire* right before our return to the Bell Street Sanctuary for worship. In that case, let this be an invitation to you to come with bells and whistles for our special celebratory service on Sunday morning, November 18, at 10:00 am. You're in for a treat. The choir will be singing, the bells will be playing, our liturgical dancers will be dancing, and a trumpet quintet will grace us with festive music as we revel in the marvelous work that has restored and enhanced the Sanctuary, the Narthex, and Fellowship Hall. New paint, new carpeting, a new organ, and a redesigned chancel area have refreshed and improved the space in a palpable way. Please take a moment to thank our Properties Committee, under the leadership of Paul Koepf, and our administrative and custodial staff, under the direction of Amy Eugene, for all they have done to spruce up the space and make it more flexible. And a huge thank you from me to all of you who have given of your time and resources to support this work and commit to a new and vibrant future.

Nor is that the only grace on the horizon. Far from it, in fact. I remind you about the upcoming Search for the Christ Child, our exciting Family Ministries event, on December 2, from 5:00-8:00 pm at the Family Life Center. There are still ways you can participate in putting that event on, from baking cookies, to leading guests on the "search," to acting in roles that put you in the middle of the story of Jesus' birth. And there's more! As many of you know, we have redesigned our Sunday morning worship schedule. 

### **Parking Reminders**



### **New Worship Services Beginning December 2**

Happy New Year! You may think it's a bit early to be wishing you that, but in terms of church seasons, Advent marks the beginning of the year. We will begin this new liturgical year on December 2, with the initiation of a second service on Sunday morning, our "Rise to Shine" service, at 11:30 am throughout Advent (December 2, 9, 16 and 23). Our traditional worship service will remain at 10:00 am, as it has been through summer and fall.

Hamilton, Joshua and I are so grateful to the RISE Committee who, under the guidance of Tim Lybarger, embarked on a process to "Re-Imagine the Sunday Experience." This team has put in countless hours engaging various groups through empathy mapping, striving to elicit peoples' hopes and dreams for a meaningful Sunday morning. Five new prototypes of worship services were created, shared with the congregation, and analyzed in terms of responses received. Thank you to all who gave input.

We are now excited to bring these new ideas to fruition. Come experience a new type of service full of invigorating music, a service that connects our passion for Christ to the relevant topics of today. Our "Rise to Shine - Spirited, Relational, and Relevant" service will feature a new musical group inviting you to sing with us as we arrange recent and familiar tunes to begin service with multiple musical selections. People of all ages and backgrounds will participate together as we seek to lift our Sunday spirits and create new pathways for connection to the Light of God. Music will seamlessly flow into the sermon and allow for a condensed service time of 45-50 minutes. Spirited, Relational, and Relevant

As we breathe life into the favored and viable features of the prototypes created, we will also try out two more: The Fifth Sunday Prototype on December 30, and the One Communion Sunday Prototype on January 6, 2019. On both of these Sundays, we will have only *one service* at 10:00 am.

The **December 30** service, a fifth Sunday, we will highlight one of the pillars of church – the pillar of service. The worship will include a service project supporting the Homeless Stand Down. See page 10 for a more detailed description.

On January 6, we will embrace the concept that family has two meanings – the individual congregants' family and the Federated family. There will again be one service at 10:00 am, which will be a family-focused gathering, and a chance for our whole church family to worship and break bread together.

We are looking forward to bringing into reality the inspirations from the RISE process, and invite you to join us in experiencing worship in new ways.



### **Immigration**

### **Environmental Justice**

Our committee is beginning to discern next steps in the road toward making Federated Church a Creation Justice church. We continue to educate ourselves and pass on information on how you can make a difference to the future of this planet. Here are some fall/winter planet-friendly tasks to help:

- 1. Electrical outlets, especially on outside walls, and light fixtures are prime places for cold air to leak into your home. Add foam gaskets behind covers and switch plates, and use safety plugs in unused outlets. Be sure to shut off the power at the fuse box or circuit panel before doing this.
- 2. Install foam covers over outside water spigots to prevent freezing.
- 3. Check for water leaks both inside and outside.
- 4. Wrap the water heater in an insulating blanket.
- 5. If you have a ceiling fan, reverse the direction ... the fan should run a clockwise so that air is being drawn upward. This pushes the air against the ceiling and down the walls, to gently re-circulate the warm air without creating a cooling "wind chill effect."

# **Telling Our Story Spotlight**

### **Our History is One of Giving**

The Telling Our Story Commission has talked about Federated Church traditions and passions that define who we are. This is what we have come up with, so far:

First, **our history is our future**. We tend to be "in it" for the long haul and support ministries for a long period of time.

Second, our history speaks to social justice. Throughout Federated's history our members and ministries have worked hard on behalf of those facing social injustice both locally and internationally.

Third, music is our passion. We are blessed by that and celebrate the fact that it's one of those things which we are known for in the greater community.

Fourth, our church serves the infirmed, helps the afflicted, aids the less fortunate, and provides a safe haven. Our faith community practices its faith through action. We not only are, we do!

Fifth, we are many voices and that diversity is a strength.

We are followers of Jesus from all walks of life – mentally and physically, racially, socio-economically, politically, with different ages, marital status, gender or sexual orientation.

And finally, **our history is one of giving.** In addition to our annual stewardship of Federated's \$1.4 million operating budget, the offerings received at Christmas Eve services supports a chosen nonprofit organization. **Since 1961, our congregation has donated a total of \$1.68 million in Christmas Eve offerings** to 48 distinct organizations. The largest number (25%) of Christmas Eve offerings has gone toward organizations that provide housing – to those dealing with domestic violence, developmental differences, or homelessness, for instance. The next largest category (18%) has been for nonprofits that provide health or welfare programs for their clients. We've also supported our sister church, St. Paul's Community Church, and international organizations with the same percentage (11%).

# **Telling Our Story Spotlight**

### **Prayer and Praise Ministry and Fellowship of Prayer**

Have you ever seen those blue prayer cards in our Sanctuary pews? Those cards are the contact point for a Federated ministry – the Prayer and Praise Ministry - that prayerfully responds to the joys and concerns of our church members. This group was established by Lou Butz in 2012 because, with as many people as we have in this congregation, Lou felt that there had to be people wanting prayers lifted up to God for loved ones and friends near and far. But how were those members going to share their joys and concerns? After seeing how other churches responded to this need, Lou came back to Federated and started the Prayer and Praise Ministry.

Confidentiality is a hallmark of this ministry. No last names are ever shared with the team members – which means there is no contact with the person writing the blue prayer card or with anyone associated with the situation. Members of the congregation place the completed blue prayer cards in the prayer box located in the Narthex next to the Sanctuary or on the Reception Desk in the Lobby and then every Monday a list is distributed to the 32 team members, so that they can hold the person, issue, or event in their prayers that week. This prayer team prays to God not only on behalf of people, but issues and events too! For example, if you know about a troubling work situation, if you learned about an event on the nightly news that concerns you, or if you are hoping for a healthy outcome of a neighbor's operation. The prayers lifted up by these team members are for concerns, as well as joys! The team especially enjoys the subsequent cards they receive asking for prayers of praise because of a joyful ending to a previously-disclosed worrisome situation.

The Prayer and Praise Ministry Team lifts up to God concerns and joys of folks who are not necessarily listed in our Fellowship of Prayer (FOP) section in each Sunday's bulletin. The FOP is where the church informs the congregation about, and includes in prayer, those within our faith community who have experienced a death or are facing medical challenges, as well as members who have celebratory milestones (e.g., the birth of a child). We include addresses so that the Fellowship of Prayer Note Writers Team, and others, can communicate support, sympathy, condolence or gratitude, as the situation dictates. For us, this is a potent way to connect congregants with each other and to pray for each other.

Being mindful of the concerns of some that congregants have many other prayers they would like others to join them in praying, we are starting to include a notation in Sunday bulletins that mentions the blue prayer cards, and that encourages congregants to submit other prayers to the Prayer and Praise Ministry Team. We continue to value those prayers highly and are simply making the invitation more explicit. This is the notation that you'll see:

We're all grateful for the care and love exhibited by the members of Federated for both members of our faith community and those outside of our community. Having the Prayer and Praise Ministry Team and the Fellowship of Prayer Note Writers Team ensures that our connection with both remains prevalent.
