

Dear friends,

As most of you know, 2019 has not started out well for the Kawolics family. On January 26, my mother was put under hospice care. One January 27 my father-in-law was put under hospice care. He died on January 28, and my mother died on February 13. Even though our parents were of an age where death was certainly on the horizon, to lose both in such a short period of time has left us reeling. We are slowly getting used to living into a new reality, a new normal.

Many pastors bemoan not having anyone to care for them because they are always having to care for those in their congregations. I feel so blessed to be here at Federated, part of this church family, where I have felt very well supported and cared for during this time. Your prayers, cards, calls, food, visits – all your many kindnesses have upheld and embraced me throughout this difficult journey, and I offer you my deep gratitude.

The times we experience changes and shifts are often times that call us to take a step back, or to re-align, re-center, and re-adjust. To this end, I have decided to take some time off this summer. Some of it is necessitated by the death of mom, and all the details an executor needs to deal with. Some of it is much needed time for healing, for healthy grieving, for self-care. I will be taking an unpaid leave-of-absence beginning June 10, and will return to work here at Federated Church on August 12.

I am happy to assure you that I will be leaving you in good hands during my absence. Rev. Judy Bagley-Bonner, who has a history as a member and staff member of Federated Church, will be coming to work here during the time I am away. I know that she will bring her many ministerial gifts to serve you well while I am gone, and I am confident that you will welcome her as she pastors here this summer.

Please know that I will carry you with me in my heart and in my prayers while I am away, and will look forward to returning at the end of the summer.

Finances at Federated

Through the first few months of 2019, we are seeing:

- * Non-pledge revenues (rentals of Family Life Center, non-pledge donations/receipts, etc.) are a bit behind budget.
- * Pledge revenues are ahead of budget because several members prepaid their entire 2019 pledges early, which is simply a timing thing and will even out to equal the budget by year end 2019.
- * Staff continues to monitor expenses which are tracking fairly close to budget, except for the spike in natural gas prices at the end of 2018 and into early 2019 which exceeded our budgeted gas expenses.
- * 2019's tight budget required us to use some designated funds to cover some operating expenses.

After those deferred commitments are fulfilled, the projects in the final phase will be completed, including two more funded gift opportunities: installing Sanctuary blinds and replacing the Family Life Center dishwasher.

With input from the Properties Committee (Keith Mast, Bill Lentz, John Giles), we look forward to updating the congregation about both the 2019 and final phase projects as the year progresses.



# **Telling Our Story Spotlight**

### **A Look Into Primetime Ministry**

This past December the TOS Spotlight shared a list of the Christmas Eve Offering recipients since 1961. Did you happen to notice that in 1982 the recipient was Elderlife – for a total of \$26,404?

The idea for Elderlife was born in 1982 at a church staff Christmas party at the home of Don & Janet Peters. Everest Derthick, long-time church member and editor of the church newsletter, lamented the absence of a program for the elders in the church. It was decided that the church's annual Christmas Eve Offering would be used to fund this new ministry. Everest thought the name should reflect how much LIFE was still in our elders, thus the name Elderlife. From its inception, Elderlife was an ecumenical program, averaging 60% of participants from Federated and 40% from the surrounding community. Since that wonderful beginning, the Elderlife program, now called Primetime, has been beautifully led by Lynn Wilson, Janet Peters, Lindy Bryson, Sue Priem, Rev. Dan DeWeese, Lisa Braun, and currently, Dolly Herschel.

Fast forward 37 years, and Primetime is still providing community and connections through social, educational, fitness, and service activities for people who are retired, active, and still in the prime of their life. Currently, those activities include:

Tai Chi classes at Bell Street

Tributaries: Chair Pilates class at the Family Life Center

Semi-monthly or three times/month

Bowling league at The Rollhouse

Bridge games at Bell Street

Out-of-town trips or in-town Fieldtrips: like visits to Blossom Music Center, Rock and Rock Hall of Fame, and Nautica Queen Cruise Ship

The Federated Forum – speaker series at Bell Street, with attendance open to anyone

Pillows for Hospice sewing program

Lunch Out – a chance for the group to get together for a mid-day meal around town

Same Boat Friends – dinners around town for widowers

Same Boat Girlfriends – dinners around town for widows

Summer picnic with bingo games

Serving lunch for the St Paul's Loaves & Fishes program

Later this month, the group will be attending a *Cinderella Gets A Makeover* program at the Chagrin Falls Historical Society Museum about the nine Marionettes - one being Cinderella - that began their life with a newly formed women's group of young mothers at Federated Church sometime in the mid-1950s. 
With events like these, Primetime continues to attract both members and non-members alike to their programs. A true outreach into our community-at-large!


#### **Federated Celebrates Eight Confirmands**
