Let's Adopt A Street Corner

Federated has been asked to partner with Safe Routes Chagrin to provide volunteer crossing guards so that they can maintain coverage at the Bell/Philomethian corner and continue to provide safety and support for students who want to walk home or to places like the Federated Church after school. If we Adopt A Corner, Federated volunteers would cover one or more shifts each week.

It's an easy 20-30 minute volunteer job and all training, equipment and safety support are provided by the Chagrin Falls Police Department and Safe Routes Chagrin. Guards can even call a substitute to fill in when needed. The shift times are 7:45-8:15am and 3:20-3:45pm Monday through Friday on days school is in session.

for a spectacular launch.


