R&R Capital Campaign Project Update

We are so thankful that 16 more households have completed their capital campaign pledges with final payments since mid-March! Along with those who are continuing to make pledge payments, the capital campaign numbers are looking good. **Thank you for your support!**

In recent months there's been quite a bit of work done on some capital campaign projects:

The Master Capital Campaign Projects List (with projects, timeline, leader and budget) was approved by Church Council,

Senior Director of People and Operations, Melissa Owen, has continued her work organizing our livestreaming equipment needs. Currently, we are using mostly borrowed equipment. The Council's Project List approval included reallocation of a capital campaign audiovisual upgrade at the Family Life Center (\$8,000) to the audiovisual livestreaming project.

A sub-committee of the Telling Our Story Commission has taken ownership of the Rebranding capital campaign project. Led by Diana Weber-Gardner, a communications professional at Cleveland Clinic and long-time member of our church, they are preparing an RFP (Request for Proposal) in search of an agency or consultant to collaborate with the sub-committee to develop and execute the developing vision. Church Council Moderator, Beth Rutkowski, supports the direction that will position the church for its second century while providing clarity for the upcoming Visionary Action Plan.

We are blessed to have such wonderfully gifted members and staff who dedicate their time, talents and treasure to complete Federated's *Rejoice* & *Renew* capital campaign projects.

I am writing to share some good news: the church recently received a grant from the Progressive Insurance Foundation for over \$8,000!

This grant represents company matching funds for contributions that Progressive employees made to Federated Church in 2019. Let us know if your company participates in a matching gift program that, like Progressive, will match gifts to religious organizations.




News and Info

Parish Nurse Corner

The clinic at St. Paul's on the near westside of Cleveland has been open for eight weeks now and we are slowly rebuilding our clientele. About half of our clients are former faces, who have been doing well during COVID. The other half are new faces just trying us out. We average about six clients per week. Our safety protocols include temperature checks, masks, six feet of distance from the nurse, and sanitizing after the clients are seen. There has been no pushback from the clients on any of this. Leslie Fincun has been helping with the clinic which is open every Tuesday. We continue to offer free hygiene supplies, underwear, referrals as needed, and blood pressure checks when requested.

Currently, we are in need of summer-weight socks, either the short ankle style or the higher crew socks. If you wish to help, please drop them off on my front or back porch, both of which are sheltered (84 Hall St. in the Village). Money donations can be made to The Federated Church, 76 Bell St., with a note on the memo line designating the Parish Nurse Fund. Due to the decrease in outside funding, St. Paul's is no longer able to help fund supplies for the clinic.

- How to study the Bible and consider its place in our lives.


WHERE: We will be using Zoom.

Support <u>bail reform</u> and <u>The Bail Project</u>. The Bail Project[™] National Revolving Bail Fund is a critical tool to prevent incarceration and combat racial and economic disparities in the bail system.

Environmental Justice

Electronics Recycling

Rescheduled to October 24 at the Family Life Center. It is important to keep our old recycled items out of landfills! Save them for the electronic recycling opportunity and save the earth.

Environmental Tip of the Month

- 1. Styrofoam cups, plates or bowls they are not biodegradable. (Buy paper or compostable instead.)
- 2. Farm raised salmon high levels of toxins and PCBs. (Buy wild caught instead.)
- 3. Beauty/body care products with parabens and phthalates these chemicals are linked to birth defects and cancer. (Choose products that have signed on to the Campaign for Safe Products.)
- 4. Plastic wrap it has PVCs which are toxic and leach into your food. (Use glass storage or reusable lids.)
- 5. High VOC paints and finishes can cause health problems like dizziness and lung, kidney damage. (Choose low- or no-VOC paints, stains, and varnishes.)
- 6. Bleached coffee filters contaminated with dioxins during the bleaching process, linked to cancer. (Buy unbleached paper filters or a reusable filter.)
- **7.** Over-packaged foods and other products over 33% of our household trash is due to over-packaging. (Buy products with minimal or reusable packaging or buy in bulk and use your own containers.)
- **8.** *Teak and mahogany* 27 million acres of rain-forest is destroyed every year from harvesting these woods. (Look for Forest Stewardship Council certified wood.)


