A Story I Felt Compelled to Share

About two months ago, in the middle of this pandemic, a friend of mine experienced a horrendous loss in her life. Her father, in his early 6o's and in excellent health, fell down the basement steps, suffering a concussion and a broken neck. He died instantly. No time to say "goodbye" or "I love you."

This incident affected me deeply. What if I died suddenly? Would my husband, children, grandchildren, and dear friends know how much I love them and what they have meant to me in my life? What can I do to let them know?

So, when my family and I were all gathered on our deck for the 4th of July, I asked them to sit down and I told them of my friend's experience. I then told them – each one – that I loved them dearly, and how special each one of the is to me, and that, when I say "I love you" at the end of a phone call, I really mean it!

It's not just some standard way to say goodbye. The other thing I told them was that, even after this life, I will still be with them, in their hearts, always! So they should feel free to talk to me, even after I'm gone.

They were all very touched by what I told them. Even through the pandemic, there were lots of hugs and kisses that day. And I feel a peace in me that, should the worst happen and I would die without seeing, hugging, kissing goodbye, and saying "I love you!",

they know, without a doubt, that I love them and will be with them in their hearts forever.

I tell you all of this in case you might want to be inspired to do something similar with your loved ones.
