

New Wooden Prayer Cross

Kiersti Critchfield Carty, our Pastoral Care Associate, had the idea to start a Prayer Cross ministry during these times of isolation. She envisioned a portable cross as way to leave our meditations, thoughts and considerations when we can't come inside into Sanctuary or Chapel. She turned to John Biel for help and he quickly got to work!

John chose cedar wood – leaving it unvarnished so that the wood appears the way that God grew the tree from which it came. The vertical slats face upward and the horizontal ones face inward, representing our inward support from God and our upward connection to God.

Prayer is an important part of our spiritual life and Federated wants to give congregants more opportunities

to further invite God into our lives through prayer. Anyone is encouraged to write their prayer requests on paper and slip them into the cross slot. Allow this sacred space to be a time of refuge and renewal for your soul.
