

From Hamilton's Desk

Dear Friends,

If you weren't part of this church, what would make you want to become part of Federated or of any church? This is the sort of "thought experiment" I sometimes engage in to reflect on the question of how we at Federated do what we do. This can be a way of thinking about how we do in attracting others to this community of faith.

The four areas we identified as part of our recent rebranding process help me to frame the question. In the first place, I still think worship has an extremely worthwhile place in the life of the world. We need communal spaces in which we can give thanks, in which we can grieve and mourn, in which we share exuberant joy. We need spaces in which we can acknowledge that we are but creatures, and that something bigger and grander than we are has bestowed on us the incomparable gift of life. If we don't raise our heads and lift our sight and learn to trust in something greater than we are, we have succumbed to a kind of spiritual malaise. Lively, engaged, spirit-filled worship is crucial to human life. The pursuit of "awed" worship animates me week after week.

A place where I can support and be supported also matters immensely. As some of you may remember, when I moved to Chagrin Falls, I was in the midst of a disabling bout with an inner-ear balance issue that left me so dizzy I couldn't even open my eyes. Here Mary and I were, new in town, and a group of singers came to our house to sing me healing songs. A Federated member visited to practice Reiki on me. And an enormous card, signed by literally hundreds of church members, was hand-delivered to our house. At a challenging time, I felt immensely supported. People who may be open to a church experience need to know that sort of support.

We all need a place, as well, to grow. Growth looks different to different people. But it always entails a process in which we become more than we are at the moment. Not busier. Not more frantic. Just more. We shed old prejudices. We let go of roadblocks and addictions. We develop in our capacity for forgiveness and acceptance. Federated's role is, in part, to facilitate such growth.

And lastly, we need a place to act. We need to be encouraged in our own ministries. No life is complete when it is only or primarily receptive and passive. It can be a tempting tendency to succumb, without even noticing it, to a sense of entitlement that makes us think the world and the church are there to serve us, rather than our being there to serve the church and the world in God's name.

As we journey through this Lenten season, may we be reinvigorated in the church's fundamental mission: to worship, to support, to grow, and to act. Not only will this enrich us who are already here. It will be the qualities that entice others to join us. May we be passionately invested in this lively and glorious mission. May we live our faith.

Rejoice & Renew Capital Campaign Project Updates

Thank you for your continued faith and investment in Federated's mission and ministries – and *for recognizing that Federated is a valuable partner in your faith journey.*

So many updates from recent Capital Campaign Projects Committee meetings!

Project Management: Melissa Owen, Laura Taylor, Becky Gruss, Brady Hively, and Keith Mast met to review all projects/budgets completed in 2020 and those beginning in 2021. An updated report was created and distributed to Church Council for review.

Rebranding: The Rebranding sub-committee of the Telling Our Story Commission, led by Diana Weber-Gardner, has been rolling out the new Brandwork and messaging.

Brand Guide Workshops: There will be workshops for Commission and Lay Leaders about how to use the primary Brand, sub-Brands and messaging to market their ministries to our faith family and the community at large.

Building Signage: A small group of the Rebranding sub-committee toured the Bell Street building to create a list of all the directional and welcoming signs/posters/pew-rack cards that need updating.

Sanctuary Shades: New window shades have been installed on the southern windows of the Sanctuary. This project was a funded Giving Opportunity – a couple associated their pledge to the campaign with this particular project – and we are so grateful for their thoughtfulness.

Altar Cross: this year work will begin on a new Altar Cross for the Sanctuary. This project was also a funded Giving Opportunity and we are so grateful for this couple's thoughtfulness.

Bell Street Parking Lot: The Properties Committee will initiate the electrical work necessary before reaching out to vendors regarding installation of a heated coil system under the exit ramp and the repaving of our church building parking lot.

Bathroom fixtures: Five hands-free faucets are being installed each month and hands-free dryers will come next.

Computer Server: a new server was installed in February.

It's through your generosity that we are able to continue with these projects.

Stewardship Updates

The collective impact of individual intentions brings vital ministries and missions to life. Thank you for your part! Here's a recap of why we're celebrating the Generosity 2021 effort we began last fall.

As of February 12, 2021:

- The number of intentions or pledges = 315
- The total dollar amount submitted = \$956,606.41, though we know more are being submitted...

That's only a 7.23% decrease from the prior year.

What a life-giving, hope-filled expression of ministry – especially in conjunction with all the uncertainty we experienced during 2020!!

The average dollar amount submitted = \$3,037

Up from \$3,015 last year

• 115 households submitted an increased intention or pledge.

Representing \$52,000+

15 of these had a percent change equal to or greater than 50%.

Our outreach and livestream efforts are working! We have something to offer – community, friendship, prayer, peace, growth, worship, and ministry with those in need. By extending our outreach through livestreaming, we have given others an opportunity to participate in the spirit of what we are about.

26 households connected with Federated and submitted brand new intentions or pledges, totaling \$39,000+.

Some represented brand new givers and some converted from non-pledge giving, thereby helping Federated with planned contributions.

Some households reconnected and recommitted after 5-10 years!

Intentions and pledges were received from Texas, Florida, Georgia, Washington, and North Carolina.

Celebrating new 24/7 capabilities!

65 households took advantage of our online Intention to Give submission form.

Others set up their own pledges and pledge payment schedules in Realm.

Our greater purpose is to provide life enrichment by fostering the spiritual growth of our members, while positively impacting the larger community. These results validate that Federated is a valuable partner in our faith journey.

Parish Nurse Corner

Baby, it's cold outside! Our folks at St. Paul's and those all over the inner city are experiencing night after night of frigid weather under bridges, on benches, in tent cities, and over sewer grates. Louise is one of these folks, and one of our most regular clients. She comes to St. Paul's often, mostly to see her friends and share a cup of coffee along with their stories. Leslie was "on duty" at the clinic the day Louise (not her real name) confided that she didn't have a sleeping bag, even though she slept every night alone in a flimsy tent. [This was her choice, because she didn't trust anyone in shelters, apartments, or on the street. She was her own person (with past traumas). She also happened to have a beautiful voice when she felt comfortable enough to share some of her favorite spirituals.] Picturing her sleeping in a cold huddle in her tent city broke our heart, and it was an easy decision for us to purchase a snug sleeping bag out of our Parish Nurse budget. The leader of the outreach program of which we are a part is Tim. He will give the bag to Louise, so as not to appear that we nurses have favorites. Thank heavens for this fund which gives us the flexibility to act above and beyond when called for.

Another blessing to ward off the cold was a large garbage bag full of small blankets to be distributed to those in need by Tim who knows who these people are and who keeps an eye on them. Moreover, he is at St. Paul's 4-6 days per week. The blankets came from Lynne Kessell's groups of ladies who have been consistently generous in their financial and material support of the PN program for the last 7 years. Thank you Lynne and ladies!



Wells was a household name in Black America during much of her lifetime (1863-1931) and was considered the equal of such well-known contemporary African American leaders as Booker T. Washington and W.E.B. DuBois. Nobel Prize-winning author, Toni Morrison reads selections from Wells' memoirs and other writings in this multi-award winning film.
