# **Capital Campaign Project Updates**

For those who were not able to join us for the Annual Meeting, here is a recap of the *Rejoice & Renew* Capital Campaign information presented:

### 2020 Overview

61 pledges were fulfilled during 2020

Representing \$600,000+ in total pledges

At this time, only 1.8% of pledges are not able to be fulfilled

Compare with national campaign average of 4%

Remaining campaign payments total less than \$50,000

Quarterly reviews of each project (completion status, invoices, and budget) is done by Becky Gruss/Brady Hively, Keith Mast, Melissa Owen, Janis Stefanchik, and Laura Taylor. The results of these reviews, and any recommendations, are presented to Church Council.

### Capital Campaign Overall - as of December 31, 2020

Total Raised-to-Date: \$2,957,980

Received commitments from 316 households and foundations

Includes deferred gifts, matching gifts, and gifts-in-kind

Includes 7 funded Gift Opportunities = pledges associated with particular projects

Minimum goal was \$2.3 million; Challenge goal was \$3 million

Church Council approved work on all projects under \$3M level

100+ volunteers devoted (and continue to devote!) **<u>countless</u>** hours to make this such a success.

Total Spent-to-Date: \$2,481,538 on 27 complex projects

### **Planting Trees Saves the Earth**


