In-Person Worship is Back Beginning Sunday, June 13!

A message from the Director of People and Operations Registration Required | Maximum of 50 Congregants

Phase III of our reopening plan includes a return to in-person worship on Sundays, beginning on Sunday June 13 with a maximum capacity of 50 congregants. Worship will begin at 10 am in the Sanctuary and simultaneous online worship will continue to be available for everyone! Please join us at YouTube.com/TheFederatedChurch for online worship. You can also click the button on our homepage at fedechurch.org for easy access.

Registration will be required for those planning to attend worship in-person. Registration for any given Sunday will open on the preceding Monday. (You be able to register for the June 13 service starting Monday, June 7.) Registration will close 48 hours prior to the event (for Sunday worship, registration will close at 10 am on Friday).

A separate registration will also be available for up to ten worship ambassadors. On the Friday before worship, I will be in contact with those who sign up to do a brief orientation. Worship ambassador duties will include warmly welcoming people into the church, checking attendees off the registration list, welcoming people into the Sanctuary, answering questions and ensuring a smooth entrance and exit into the church and Sanctuary.

There will be two ways to register for in-person worship:

Online: You can register online using the "Register for In-Person Worship" button on the homepage of the Federated website (will be available starting June 7) or through your Realm account, where you will find it listed as an event. When you register online, you will be able to register multiple members of your family with a single

registration. Be sure to complete all the steps. There are several. <u>Successful registration will result in a confirmation email that you must bring with you on Sunday as proof of registration.</u> It can be printed or displayed on your smart phone. If you do not receive such an email, your registration may not have been completed and you should try again.

Phone Call: You can call the church at 440.247.6490 x111 and leave a message for Melinda Smith. The message should include how many members of your family plan to attend. She will call you back to confirm your registration; if you do not receive confirmation, please assume the registration is full and plan to attend a future service instead.

Upon arrival on Sunday morning, you will check in with a worship ambassador at the parking lot or Bell Street entrances.

Here are the details for in-person worship:

Masks: While inside the church building, you must wear a mask covering both your nose and mouth. Your mask must be worn at all times and must be worn whether or not you have been vaccinated. This will remain our church policy until otherwise indicated. Clergy and worship participants may be unmasked when speaking. Feel free to sing along, but do keep your mask in place.

Available seating will be designated. Please respect others' comfort levels with distancing and social interaction.

Childcare will not be provided during this phase of re-opening.

We will not share communion during this phase of re-opening.

The passing of the peace will be done at a distance.

An opportunity to leave an offering will be available as you depart the Sanctuary.

Fellowship Hour will not be held inside the Bell Street building.

We realize that not all people are able to receive the vaccine, including those with prohibitive medical conditions and young children. To ensure all have an opportunity to attend, we will continue to require masks. If you are able to be vaccinated, you are encouraged to do so, not only to protect yourself, but to mitigate the risk of spreading the virus to others. We all long to put this pandemic behind us and move on and encourage you to do your part. We are constantly monitoring health and safety guidelines and we will continue to evaluate and make adjustments based on current scientific data. We understand everyone's comfort level will be different and we will continue to respect and celebrate those differences and each other.

the Christ Child, to which she has devoted immense energy. That pre-Christmas event has engaged countless Federated people in its compelling drama. And it has opened our doors to numerous community members who have gotten, through that event, a great taste of who Federated is. In her pastoral care role, Kiersti has shown deep and abiding care for members and friends of Federated who have needed the support and prayers of this faith community. Kiersti's absence, too, will be keenly felt. We have been so richly blessed by both of them. And we wish them Godspeed.

The paradox of such departures, of course, is that, while they bring a palpable sense of loss and grief, they also open Federated to new and promising chapters. Church Council has appointed a search team from its members who have gone immediately to work to fill the position of associate pastor on a temporary basis while we engage in a search for a settled associate pastor. In the next few months, we hope to engage a designated associate pastor who will also, if they are interested, be eligible for the settled position.

In the meantime, once our Visionary Action Plan (VAP) is fleshed out, a search committee will be formed from among our membership, a committee that will engage in a search for the associate pastor who will carry out the ministry we identify, and who best fits with Federated's energy, identity, and mission.

In addition, as that VAP is completed, we will identify how best to carry out the ministries vacated by Kiersti and Dolly. For the time being, Melissa Owen, our Senior Director of People and Operations, has graciously offered to ensure coverage on both of those fronts. Her leadership in this time of flux will enable us to configure the staff in the most productive way as we go forward.

Nor is that all on the change front! We are just now preparing to open our worship services for in-person gatherings beginning in mid-June. What a gift that will be! We will continue to livestream, of course. But we will also have the chance to connect again in person. Details on that reopening are on pages 1 and 2 in this issue of The Spire. What a promising development!

The upshot of all this is that we are in a position of acute flux. There are notable losses that go with that change, and we need to grieve appropriately and fully.

At the same time, though, change is a glorious opportunity for us to engage with God in new and immensely fruitful ways. New staff will come. New energy will bloom. New opportunities will emerge.

I want to say that I will greatly miss Mark, Kiersti, and Dolly. And also that I am very much looking forward to this next chapter in Federated's life. The possibilities are endless and they fill me with excitement. I know you will join me in the fullness of what's to come. Together we will be filled by God's grace, and led to new pastures. What a blessing!





SJAM Environmental Justice Activities

April and May were full of activities to bring awareness to, care for, and opportunities to think about the future of God's Earth we call home. What is God calling us to do and be in an age of climate crisis and the intersection of systemic racism with the degradation of Earth's limited resources?

SJAM worked in collaboration with several partners, including the Community Life Collaborative (CLC), CF Methodist Church, the Chagrin Valley Council of Churches and the Western Reserve Land Conservancy. The focus throughout April and May was to keep the conversation, awareness of issues, witness to lament and transformation, and call to action on behalf of the environment, while co-creating honest, hands-on and aspirational programs. Protecting the environment and all God's creation requires so much more than loving the outdoors. It requires all of us to collaborate and work together.

It takes many hands and deliberate decisions to turn the tide, and God is counting on all-hands-on-deck. We share here a brief summary of our Earth Activities and plan to continue with this focus throughout the year.

Family Earth Day Activity

In spite of cold weather about 50 people of all ages gathered at the Family Life Center (FLC) for a celebration of Earth Day, on Sunday, April 25. The theme centered on the importance of both enjoying and protecting the environment, especially trees. Those gathered enjoyed a children's story/discussion about appreciating nature, a nature hike through the FLC grounds, a nature scavenger hunt, prepackaged healthy snacks, and potting tree seedlings to take home and plant. The group also helped weed and clear debris from beds at the FLC. It was a fun-filled afternoon where wearing masks made us able to connect in person! Strengthen the Church Offering

To Be Collected June 6

Parish Nurse and Thrift Shop Corner

Our Parish Nurse Clinic has been busy every Tuesday morning counseling with clients and giving them the hygiene supplies they need. A nice group of regulars has come together for "coffee and conversation" and most of them visit the clinic too. The Clinic is supported by the Outreach Program which is a non-profit program that also helps with housing, utility bills, and re-establishing legal identity (Social Security, birth certificates, bank accounts, etc). This function is especially important for those who have been incarcerated, because they are released without any of their original ID documents! Money for this non-profit program comes largely from grants written by our director, Tim Walters. In addition, your monetary and material donations are a big help (don't forget to designate Parish Nurse Program on the memo line of your check.) And thank you for your generosity!

This month, the Outreach Program partnered with a public health agency called Community Family Practice to give COVID vaccines at St. Paul's to the population we serve. The agency supplied all the personnel, equipment, signage, and handouts and they set up a very efficient walk-through traffic pattern through the front of the church. A doctor administered the shots and was available to answer questions. There is a lot of fear surrounding the vaccines and thus we only vaccinated five people on our first day. Tim plans on holding many more vaccine clinics on Tuesday mornings to try to eventually gain trust with more folks ready to be vaccinated. On May 11 we had J & J vaccines and on May 18 we offered both the J & J and Moderna vaccines. This is an exciting and challenging new mission for the Outreach Program and the Parish Nurses who support and encourage the clients to trust the vaccines.

The thrift shop is not a part of the Outreach Program, but they obviously serve the same population of folks in poverty or starting over after an eviction, rehab programs, or jail. I am still requesting small household items and decorative pieces to be brought to my house at 84 Hall St. (*No china please*.) These items might have been designated for Trinkets and Treasures but are accumulating because the pandemic is causing a delay in the event. More items are still needed to "fill the shelves" with cheerful homemaking goodies.

Thanks again for your support for these important programs. PS. Thanks to all of you who contributed to the white sock collection May 11. The back of my CRV was full! They will go very quickly at St. Paul's.





Summer Book Study with Rev. Judy Bagley-Bonner


