Good News from the Mission and Service Commission 2021 Christmas Eve Offering Recipient

We are pleased to announce the recipient of our 2021 Christmas Eve offering! The agency that the Mission & Service Commission felt most reflected Federated's priority of inclusion and social justice is **A Place 4 Me**.

A Place 4 Me serves youth ages 18-25 who are transitioning out of foster care, juvenile justice, or who are currently homeless or at risk of homelessness. Many of these youth are of color and/or are LGBTQ. The goal is to eliminate youth homelessness through an innovative program called Opportunity Passport that addresses financial literacy and responsibility.

Our offering will be directly deposited into the youths' own supervised bank account in the amount of \$100.00. Program funds from grants and donations provide \$1 for \$1 matching funds as students complete classes that are created collaboratively by them with a program leader. As each account builds, the young adults can begin spending their savings on approved assets such as one month's rent, health care costs (including dental), educational expenses (books or a computer), a car, investments (stocks or CDs), or entrepreneurial enterprises.

In addition, peer youth navigators are available to help youths through the shelter system, unsheltered homelessness (cars, camps), or bouts of "couch surfing." The navigators coach young people on how to talk with landlords and case workers, where to look for good paying jobs and trustworthy landlords, how to obtain a GED, and how to get along with family members. A Place 4 Me, housed at the YWCA of Greater Cleveland, has served 258 youths since its inception (2018). It currently supports 128 young people.

From the Desk of Rev. Hamilton Throckmorton

Dear Friends,

It's hard to believe that December is nearly upon us! Where has the fall gone? And it's striking that COVID-19 is still with us, still very much shaping the life we live together.

If you're like me, there's a sense in which you grow used to this new normal. We always have our masks with us. We avail ourselves of vaccines and their booster shots. We grow accustomed to the dance of distance we so often need to do to try to keep ourselves safe from the virus. We've learned how to go about our business.

At the same time that we become somewhat inured to this ongoing pestilence, we also, though, grieve what we still miss. Travel becomes a guessing game of risk and reward. Masks constrict us and prevent us, sometimes, from recognizing each other. The growing sense of freedom we had in the early summer gives way to a discouragement with the apparent endlessness of the disease.

So as we come to this season of lights, with Hannukah and Christmas enticing us forward, we look beyond us to the only One who can give us the peace and joy for which we so desperately long. And we do long. We ache for brightness and spirit and delight. In a striking departure from even recent years, we notice Christmas trees and holiday lights going up much earlier than ever before. People want visible signs of hope. They want vivid displays of happiness and thrills. No wonder trees and lights and greenery go up so early. It's what people crave in order to get through the turbulence and disruption.

As wonderful as those lights are, though, we also need something more. Those lights point to the One who graces us with favor and care. And it's to that One that we look during this Advent and Christmas season.

We see signs of God all around us. One that stands out to me in these last few weeks is a reconnection some of us have had with our Muslim neighbors. In mid-November, Mary and I and a number of Federated people joined the Northern Ohio Intercultural Association for a Thanksgiving dinner at Holbrook Hollows. I spoke that evening about gratitude, and I was filled with my own gratitude as we joined together to share a meal and to build community.

Then, on November 19, the new mosque built by the Chagrin Valley Islamic Center was formally dedicated in a ceremony in their just-completed building. Mary and I joined them for that dedication, and other Federated people were treated to an open house the following day. While we were not in attendance at the November 19 Friday jumah, or opening worship service, as soon as Mary and I arrived for the ensuing dedication service, one of the members of CVIC greeted us and said, "Federated Church was mentioned in the sermon as one of the very first contributors to the building of the mosque." They were immensely grateful for the support Federated had offered, and for the early boost in support that it gave to them. And I sensed the richness of God's presence in this shared endeavor, and in our great camaraderie.

As we look for signs of hope this Advent and Christmas season, let us look to the grace and wonder of what God is doing in our midst. God's relentless care for all of us is a vivid display of God's ongoing blessing of us and our world. May we be filled to overflowing by the light of the world that holds us close always.

TAX-WISE GIVING IN 2021

IF YOU TAKE THE STANDARD DEDUCTION

Under the CARES Act, in 2021, gifts to charities like our church qualify for a "universal deduction" above and beyond the existing standard deduction. The limit is \$300 for individuals and \$600 for married couples filing jointly. So keep your charitable receipts this year, because in 2021 you can take a modest charitable deduction in addition to the standard deduction.

IF YOU ITEMIZE

The CARES Act increased the previous charitable deduction limit of 60% adjusted gross income to 100%. That means, if you can afford to give away as much as you earn, **you can completely offset your income with charitable giving for 2021.**

Consider gifting pre-tax money

If you're over age 70.5, you can give to the church directly from a traditional IRA. Required minimum distributions were suspended for 2020 under the CARES Act, but this year they're back. Failing to withdraw the required minimum can result in fees and penalties. By calling the financial institution that holds your IRA and asking them to send a distribution directly to the church, you won't be liable for income tax on the gift, but the total amount of the gift (up to \$100,000 per year of charitable giving) will count towards your required minimum distribution.

People of all ages can make gifts of stocks, bonds, or mutual funds. When you give appreciated assets directly to the church, no capital gains tax is due.



Parish Nurse Corner

A Message from Parish Nurse Kathy Kolcaba

WINTER! It's upon us, and many of us here in the Chagrin Valley enjoy the cold, crisp days, the sparkling snow, trees and shrubs coated in white, and the intense blue skies. But in the inner city, there are many folks living most of their time on the streets. On my last visit to St. Paul's, the first seven folks who came in were homeless and asking if we had any <u>coats</u>. Tim, outreach coordinator, was beside himself because he didn't have any to give.

Hearing that, I knew I would have to find some reasonably priced coats to bring in. Fortunately, we had enough money in our church account so I could comfortably buy good coats priced low. We were in luck at Kohl's where they had unisex winter coats with hoods on sale for \$35 each. I bought six of them in different sizes.

This is an example of how the Parish Nurse responds to the needs of our clients. It is a rewarding and interesting volunteer job, to which I have been devoted for ten years. Now, however, I am at the age where I am no longer comfortable driving across town on 480 in the snow or rain. So I have decided to retire at the end of this year.

I am hoping someone will be interested in taking my place, which is to commit to coming to St. Paul's every Tuesday morning from 9-12. Suitable backgrounds for this job would be teaching, medicine, nursing, social work, counseling – any of the helping professions. I can help orient and introduce anyone who would like to try it. And I will continue to bring supplies and donations to the clinic, weather permitting or when I can get a driver (my husband comes to mind!). Phil Fogarty will continue to receive supplies for distribution to his street people.

As always, thank you for your continuing support of St. Paul's Parish Nurse Clinic in whatever capacity you can manage.

Winter Book Study-Prayer Group







SJAM's December Focus: Women and Children's Issues



The History of Christmas Ornaments

Mary Lou Smullen was born and raised in the Cleveland area. She graduated from Orange High School and Ohio University. In 1975 she entered the United States Army via a Direct Commission.
