FROM THE REV. JUDY'S DESK

Dear Friends,

I want to begin by thanking Trisha and Hamilton for the opportunity to write "Page Two" of THE SPIRE in my last month with you, and in my last month of professional ministry. I tried to say something about all this in my sermon on March 20 where I reflected a bit on my faith having come full-circle over the course of my lifetime and over the course of my ministry. Indeed, I have arrived at what Paul Ricouer calls "the second naivete" which is a return to a simpler, more child-like faith after having it tested through the rigors of science and empiricism and liberal theology. I like what T.S. Eliot said in his poem, "Little Gidding."

*"We shall not cease from exploration
And the end of all our exploring
Will be to arrive where we started
And know the place for the first time.
Through the unknown, remembered gate
When the last of earth left to discover
Is that which was the beginning...
Quick now, here, now always-
a condition of complete simplicity costing not less than everything.
And all shall be well and all manner of things shall be well..."*



For me, this return to an informed but child-like faith has everything to do with prayer and I have discovered anew the richness of a life marinated in prayer. You see, I believe that thoughts are things and are an energy form, and that putting our prayerful thoughts "out there" actually changes, however imperceptibly, the chain of energy in the world. If you want to learn more, I refer you again to Teresa Blythe's [50 Ways to Pray](#). And please know I will be praying for you as a church community.

In the meantime, I thank you for allowing me to come home to complete my ministry. I was baptized, confirmed, married and ordained at Federated and have served you once as a four year staff member, and six times now as summer fill-in or interim. Many of you have asked about our plans for retirement, and our intention is to keep our little trailer in Florida as home-base because Brian's mother is there, and also because we can live inexpensively there which allows us to travel. But we also hope to find somewhere to call home here for half the year (with Brian commuting monthly to care for his mom) by way of a tiny, studio apartment or seasonal campground wherein to park our soon-to-be-acquired camper. We will offer a lengthy break to let you bond with your wonderful, new Designated Associate Pastor, and plan to be back in the pews during the six or so months per year that we hope to live in this area.

So may God's richest blessings be upon you, dear ones. And may Federated always be a faith community steeped in prayer and in God's amazing love.

A Message from Your Search Committee

May the grace and peace from God the Holy Spirit, our Father/Mother and the Lord Jesus Christ be with you all. This message comes to you from your Associate Minister Search Committee. We would like to share an update here about where we are in the process and invite you to pray with us as we discern what God is asking us to do.

The associate pastoral search process has three distinct seasons: a time of internal preparation before the search, a time of seeking and selecting new pastoral leadership, and a time of affirming and welcoming the newly-called minister. We are now in the second phase of this process.

We have completed an extensive church profile based on our Visionary Action Plan along with a job description for the "Pastor of Transformational Ministries" position and have placed it on the United Church of Christ website. Our search committee is reading ministerial profiles, screening candidates, conducting interviews, and we will eventually select a candidate who will be recommended to the entire congregation.

Our goal is for the congregation to elect, in a unified way, a new pastor whose gifts God can use with us and among us for the sake of the Gospel. The tradition practiced in the UCC of "calling" a pastor affirms the active presence of God's Spirit in the search process. We are prayerfully seeking a pastor with particular gifts and skills while recognizing that candidates are also engaged in a Spirit-led discernment process. We are working closely with our UCC conference, the Living Water Association, and the conference minister, Nayiri Karjian, throughout this process.

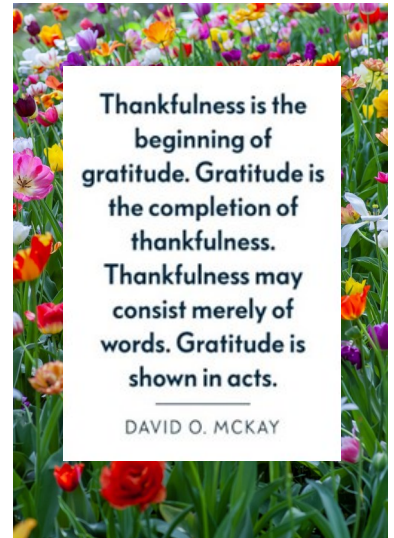

- One fingernail or toenail clipper removed from the package (either one is acceptable)
- One bath-size bar of soap in the original package
- One toothbrush in the original package
- Ten standard size Band-Aids

A Message from Tim Walters, St. Paul's Director of Outreach

Spring has sprung and I breathe a sigh of relief. It has been a tough winter for all but especially those we serve. The cold, the wet, and the snow have a way of working into their lives. It dwindles many spirits and contributes to more than a little depression and anxiety.

Yet most who come to see us for health and hygiene still manage to provide a smile, a quiet comment, and, of course, a thank you. Sure, it might take a hot coffee and a moment of rest in a warm environment before a positive nature comes forth, but that is true of all of us.

I have been reflecting over the past few days as to my current position of interim director of outreach at St. Paul's. Some of you may know that I have been partially retired for some time now and recently celebrated my 79th birthday. My reflections led me to give thanks for what God has recently allowed me to do. 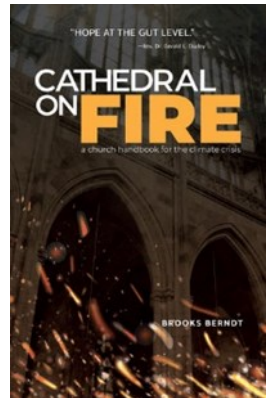
Cathedral on Fire - Meet the Author & Book Discussion

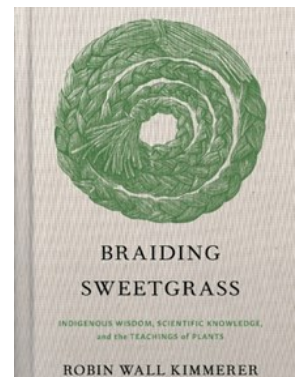

USCRI wants to supply all 80+ plus families that they are serving with a rice cooker, a crock pot, and a television. If you have any of those items in great condition, you can either bring them to Lisa Ciocia (440.897.2413), or to Temple Beth El.

There is also a need for sponsors, which can take many different forms. You can volunteer to drive someone to appointments, etc., or just to visit a family and speak English to them. Donations for people from Ukraine

The local agencies are anticipating that due to the Ukrainian population in Cleveland, we will be receiving refugees. Lisa is recommending a particular agency called Razom, meaning together. They began in NYC in 2014 with a group of ex-pats and Ukrainian Americans and work directly with Ukrainians in Ukraine and now in Poland. They have raised \$4 million in the past week, and are flying containers directly over to Poland. You can find them at www.razomforukraine.org. You will hear songs and calls, some sweet and musical like the Yellow Warbler and others harsh like the Green Heron, and learn something interesting about each bird.

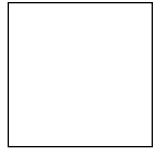
