Dear Friends,

# Greetings from the Church Council A Message from Rick Bryan, Moderator

May the grace and peace from God be with you all.

Too often, the congregation only hears from the Church Council during the Annual Meeting in February, or if there is a special announcement or issue. The goal in this message is to update you on the important work the Church Council is doing on your behalf.

The Council meets the first Tuesday of each month from 7 – 8:30 PM. Since the pandemic, we have been meeting via Zoom. Our meetings open with prayer, and a report from our clerk, Peggie Jo Shinagawa, who has been so attentive and responsive to the constitutional and policy guidelines of the church.

We receive formal reports from Rev. Hamilton Throckmorton and Melissa Owen, Senior Director of People & Operations, which are helpful updates on the spiritual and operational life of Federated Church. There are often questions from these reports, which leads to interaction among all members of the Council.

The current Church Council members are Brendan Buescher, Past Moderator; Peggie Jo; Doug Harlan; Alexandra Ziots; Dan Kershner; Diane Tuuri; and Kelly Kimball. Hamilton Throckmorton is a voting member of the Church Council. Melissa Owen is a non-voting member of Council.

As outlined in the Annual Meeting in February, the Council's focus is two-fold. The first is the oversight of the Associate Pastor Search Committee. The second is the implementation of the Visionary Action Plan (VAP); the strategic blueprint for Federated Church in the next three to five years. In the past months, we have formulated our tasks in assigning action steps to each of the six commissions and six committees.

Our initial focus has been on the overlap between the Worship and Music Commission and the Congregational Care Commission. In the month of May, we will focus on the Telling Our Story Commission.

We could use your <u>help</u> in terms of your time and talent in serving on the Church Council, or one of the Commissions or Committees. This is a direct nudge to recruit and solicit you to become involved in the life of the church, beyond simply attending worship. Some of you are quite active in one of our ministry teams, for which we are grateful. Some have served as a church leader in prior years and feel it is time for others to step up. We remain grateful for your past work and faithful expertise.

In the past few weeks, five members of the congregation have been elected to a commission or committees. Thank you to Carolyn Shaul, Phil Fogarty, Rose Brown, Dawn Herdman, and Betsy Mast.

Generally, these appointments are three-year terms. Commission or committee meetings average once a month for an hour to 90 minutes. There is a chair of each group.

The six Church Commissions are:

Worship and Music – Glorifying God in Worship and Communion
Congregational Care – Bonding our Federated Church Community
Spiritual Life – Encouraging being Shaped in the Christian Gospel
Mission and Service – Encouraging Involvement in Mission and Service to the great community.
Telling our Story – Sharing our Faith
Generosity – Sharing our Resources

Each Commission has openings for an interested member of the congregation. The greatest need is in the Worship and Music Commission. They work to glorify God and to coordinate and enhance the spiritual life of Federated Church through the conduct of public worship, the ministry of music, and the care of the Sanctuary and furnishings. As well they prepare the elements and assist with the serving of Communion on the first Sunday of each month.


# Climate Anxiety: What We Can Do About It
