From the Desk of Rev. Throckmorton

Dear Friends,

As I write, change is in the air. Overnight, we've just gone from temperatures in the mid-80s to overnight lows in the low 40s. Halloween decorations are filling windows and lawns. Several weeks ago, in mid-September, Mary and I heard the Christmas carol "Joy to the World" in a local store. Fall and winter and what we refer to generically as "the holidays" will soon be upon us. The days rush by and stop for nothing.

Prayer is, in a sense, an intentional pause in this relentless march of days and seasons. It's our way of savoring what we have from God. I pray, as I imagine you do, as well, in a variety of ways. But one of the primary ways I pray is to express my gratitude. I look back at what has been and say, "Thank you." Often I do this at the end of the day, in a prayer form with long and deep roots called the "examen." I remember and take stock of the richness of the day's details.

As September gives way to October, I pause to give thanks for the energy and joy and fun of Rally Day on September 11. Melissa Owen and numerous church members and friends helped set up and clean up and cook and offer financial support for the delicious ice cream and the creative balloon-maker and the superb band, AJ and the Woods (featuring Federated member Zach LeFeber!) that graced us with their music. What a fantastic way to begin a new program year!

The very next Sunday, at Plymouth Church, UCC, Shaker Heights, we had the privilege of sharing in the ordination into Christian ministry of our Pastor for Transformational Ministries, the now REVEREND Betsy Wooster. The service itself was a full and captivating one, with wonderful preaching and music and the bestowing of some special gifts from significant churches in Betsy's life. Federated gave to Betsy a purple stole, pictured on p. 22. A stole is the liturgical piece that is draped around the neck of a clergy person and hangs at the front of the robe. It represents a yoke, the sort of yoke that would be tied to a horse or oxen, and signifies that, as clergy, we are bound to Christ in all we do and are. The yoke Federated gave to Betsy is purple. She will wear it in March and April during the season of Lent, as a sign of repentance and humility as she and all of us turn, again and again, to Christ.

I give God thanks and praise for all this and more. We at Federated are abundantly blessed. May we celebrate the richness of God's presence in and among us this fall and beyond.



We will collect each of the 4 Sundays during November outside Fellowship Hall.






Troop 150– Holiday Greens Fundraising



Confirmation at Federated Church

"You're here to be light, bringing out the God-colors in the world. God is not a secret to be kept. We're going public with this, as public as a city on a hill. 
