From the Desk of Rev. Betsy...

November, A Time to Go Deep: Reformation Sunday, All Saints Sunday, Reign of Christ Sunday, and yes, even Advent!

Dear Federated Church.

This is one of those unique years when Advent begins in late November. Are we ready for it yet? Not really! Wonderful as the Advent and holiday seasons are, it is easy to get caught up in the details that the dawn of Advent, a time of waiting and preparing, means in our daily lives. We begin to think about the gifts we will buy, wrap, and give, when to put up the Christmas tree, the flights we need to book, the family and friends we will host, the parties we might or might not attend, and on and on and on. These are meaningful things that can bring us joy, and they can also crowd our senses and separate us from our connection to God.

Consider this: waiting and preparing for Advent is impossible if we aren't first attuned to God's presence within us. Now is a time to go deeper into our prayer lives as we begin waiting and preparing for the season of waiting and preparing! The month of November is full of sacred opportunities to nurture our spiritual lives and tap into the sacredness of life itself:

- **-October 30th** was Reformation Sunday, a day that commemorated the history of our faith and the way that God's spirit continues to be with the church through the ages.
- **-November 6th** is All Saints Day, when we remember the saints in light who have gone before us and whose lives remind us of the light and wonder of God.
- **-November 20th** is Reign of Christ Sunday, when we give thanks and praise for the fullness of both Jesus' divinity and humanity.

We are in a pre-Advent time that, if we let it, can deepen our ability to see clearly the light of God in ourselves, in the sacred earth, and in each other. Celtic Spiritual teacher John Phillip Newell writes about the Celtic wisdom of reawakening, specifically the "reawakening of our souls," in his book Sacred Earth, Sacred Soul. Newell makes a connection between our ability to pay attention to our souls and our ability to reawaken the sacred ways of God within and around us.

So, let's slow down and give thanks for the light of God that forever envelopes us, yet often eludes us. Let's look to our ancestors, who kept the faith in their own times of struggle, who prayed to, and sought solace in, the presence of God known to us through Jesus Christ. Let us quiet our souls and pray without ceasing that the light of Christ may also be known in us.

The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world (John 1:9).

A Prayer of Celtic Awareness: Awake, O my soul, To the sacred stream of light that Runs through you.

Federated Staff is ever-evolving to meet the needs of our congregation and community. Last month you read about our full time staff and in September you learned what our Faith Formation Staff is doing. Now let's take a look at what's new with some of our other Staffers:

Laura Taylor, Fundraising Liaison – Laura has been an enormous blessing, guiding Federated through Fundraising; she led us through the Capital Campaign, shepherded the evolution from a Committee to what is now the Generosity Commission. What you may not know about Laura is her behind the scenes work: Laura ensures donations are properly allocated and that gratitude is expressed and shared. She puts articles and notes of thanks in our Spire newsletter; and, every Sunday, the Generosity Impact Moment (GIM) during worship is a direct result of Laura's work with the Generosity Commission and her staff partner, Marty Culbertson. From the Desk of Rick Bryan, Moderator...

The October Church Council meeting was held on Tuesday, October 4th. The agenda focused on three main issues. The first was Imagining the Church Council at full strength. This was based on a series of recent discussions I have had about restoring the Council and the lay leadership to full strength so that we can fulfill the mission of our lay leadership. At the time of the meeting, we were missing a Treasurer, and Councilors for Generosity, Telling our Story, and Spiritual Formation. In addition, the Worship and Music Commission is very small.

We filled the councilor for Spiritual Formation by electing Sunny Doxey to that role. The Council has approved the first reading of a policy stating that if a commission does not have a councilor, the commission chair should attend Council meetings and have a vote, until a new councilor is elected. We also determined that lay leadership will become a focus of the Council in the months ahead.

The second item we explored was how Mission and Service is meeting some of the major themes of the VAP. These are the four questions we used to focus our discussion:

- A. What major initiatives is Mission and Service undertaking to meet the major themes of the VAP?
- B. What are some of the proposed action steps that Mission and Service are not taking on, and why?
- C. What will Mission and Service need from the Church Council in the next year?
- D. How do you plan to interact with other commissions in fulfilling your initiatives?

The Council was blessed to have the insight and wisdom of the Mission and Service Commission Chair Linda Zelazny and Councilor Dan Kershner. We learned about the robust level of activities led and sponsored by Mission and Service. They asked for support of commission events, especially the new proposal for Federated Church to become a Creation Justice Church.

Finally, the Council addressed a proposal to allow for beer and wine to be served at approved events at 76 Bell Street. This question was last discussed five years ago and was voted down. The Family Life Center was granted the ability to host events with alcohol, but the church building was not.

Addressing the issue now was based on two factors. One was whether the church was missing out on hosting events (arts performances, receptions) by its restrictive policy and the additional revenue they might bring? Two, the intent of many of the suggestions of the VAP strategic plan was to bring the church closer to the community through welcome and featuring our programs and service opportunities. Were we holding ourselves back with our current policy?

We first raised the issue at the September meeting. Council members were charged with seeking the opinions and feedback from commission and committee meetings and talks with individual members of the congregation. In our October meeting we heard the viewpoints of many people, both pro and con. Some were extreme in their opinions, many were somewhat neutral, feeling that if there was a strong checks and balance system on potential events, that modifying the policy was worth a try. We agreed that this would result in few proposals in the immediate year ahead.

The proposed policy allows only beer and wine, and the consumption of alcohol only in Fellowship Hall. Events must first be approved by the Senior Director of People and Operations, and then the rental agreement must be approved by a majority vote of the Church Council in advance of the event. No Federated Church funds may be used to purchase beer and wine for the event in question, nor may beer or wine be sold.

The measure passed. There are no events, at the moment, being considered by the Church Council.

The November Council meeting will focus on the work of the Generosity Committee.



As we enter into this time of gratitude and commitment, I thought I would reiterate a portion of the "generosity witness" that I provided while serving as Worship Leader on October 23rd. I referenced an illustration that came from a book I am reading, "The Power of Unwavering Focus". It is written by a man named Dandapani – a Hindu Priest, Entrepreneur and former Monk of 10 years. He was a keynote speaker at this year's Human Resources State Conference. He was talking about our personal energy. He said that the center of the napkin is our energy and the four corners represent four key aspects of our life, such as family, faith, work and leisure. If you have positive energy, it is uplifting. As it rises, the four key aspects also rise ... positive energy brings positive outcomes.

I found myself thinking of generosity in that manner. Take the same napkin or tissue and think of it as our church, Federated Church. Then, consider the center to be generosity and the four corners to be: (1) Worship and Music (2) Programs and Staff (3) Missions and (4) The Building or physical facility. As generosity individually and collectively rises more intentionally, the four corners also rise and are enriched.

Several lay leaders have already submitted their intentions to our 2023 "From Bread and Cup to Faith and Giving" generosity campaign.

We will gather on Gratitude Sunday, November 13th and will be invited to submit our intentions for 2023. I invite you to join us in intentionally and prayerfully raising up your level of generosity, giving back a meaningful portion of what we have been provided, so that the four corners of our 'Federated napkin' can also rise and enrich our lives and countless lives beyond these walls.







Thank you to everyone who contributed to the October Mission Trailer for the collection of items for Refugees living in the Cleveland Area. There is still a great need for many items. Will you partner with us to help fill the Missions Trailer with our love as these families set up their new home? These items should be new or like-new quality. **Urgent Needs are in BOLD**.

- Kitchen: can openers, spatulas, wooden spoons, measuring cups, sieves, graters, **cutting boards**, mixing bowls (metal or glass), flatware trays, complete sets of flatware, **steak knives**, **cutting knives**, large plates, salad plates, soup bowls, glasses, cups, **strainers**, serving bowls, platters, kitchen towels, oven mitts, large frying pans, stock pots with lids, sauce pans, large oven safe baking dishes and large microwave safe serving bowls
- Bedroom: blankets, comforters, sheet sets and mattress pads (full and twin), pillows
- Bathroom: heavy shower liners, shower rings, bath mats, bath towels, hand towels, washcloths
- Cleaning: hand soap, brooms, dustpans, mops, buckets, floor cleaner, toilet bowl cleaner, toilet brushes, dish soap, thirteen gallon kitchen trash cans with lids, small bathroom trash cans (and trash bags), Vacuums (new only)
- Laundry: baskets, detergent, hangers, clotheslines, clothespins
- Lamps: floor and table (working order), **Rugs**: new or gently used must have been professionally cleaned recently, Bags: **Reusable grocery bags large and small**, Rolling shopping cart



Environmental and Creation Justice

Water = Life - God's world and specifically the water on the earth is threatened.

What do you know about the Great Lakes? The Great Lakes are a breathtaking and unique natural resource. They are the world's largest surface freshwater ecosystem holding about 90% of the freshwater in the United States and 20 percent of all surface freshwater on the planet. The Great Lakes include eight states and Canada which means that more than forty million people depend on this system for clean drinking water.



And, did you know that threats to the Great Lakes' ecosystems include invasive species, climate change, pollution, and habitat destruction? Climate change affects water temperatures, weather patterns, and lake levels. Pollutants from residential, agricultural, and industrial areas reduce water quality. Land development decreases the amount of wildlife habitat. Fish populations have been declining in recent years as a result of these threats and increased fishing pressure.

The Great Lakes Restoration Initiative (GLRI) is a public-private partnership that provides major investments in the Great Lakes' health, ecosystem, and water quality—more than \$2.9 billion in GLRI funding has been used for over 6,000 projects in the Great Lakes. Protecting the Great Lakes and other freshwater resources that drive our local economies, host important biodiversity, and serve as drinking water for millions of people should be a top environmental focus. Currently \$375 million is authorized to fund the GLRI and it will increase by \$25 million per year until it reaches \$475 million in 2026.

The GLRI strategically targets the biggest threats to the Great Lakes ecosystem and to accelerate progress toward achieving long term goals. It was developed with input from states, tribes, local governments, universities, business and others. It outlines priorities and goals working to accelerate environmental progress in these Focus Areas:

- Toxic Substances and Areas of Concern
- Invasive Species under control
- No new self-sustaining invasive species
- Nonpoint Source Pollution Impacts on Nearshore Health
- Foundations for Future Restoration Actions
- Fish safe to eat
- Water safe for recreation
- Safe source of drinking water
- All Areas of Concern delisted
- Harmful/nuisance algal blooms eliminated
- Native habitat protected and restored to sustain native species

There are also organizations like the *Alliance for the Great Lakes*, a non-profit, nonpartisan organization working across the region to protect our most precious resource: the fresh, clean, and natural waters of the Great Lakes.

The Great Lakes are massive and awe-inspiring. But they are at risk if we do not take care of them. Learn more about what you can do to support the efforts of organizations like the Alliance for the Great Lakes. https://greatlakes.org/
