From the Desk of Rev. Throckmorton...

Dear Friends.

Having now had a bout with COVID, I feel as though I'm more connected than ever with the human race! Like many of you, I had avoided it for more than 2½ years, and had frankly begun to get a little smug about my great ability to avoid the virus! Ha! And with that latest hubris-balloon now popped, and one more illusion of hoped-for invincibility shattered, I remember that we're all human, and that illnesses and accidents come and go.

While this encounter of mine with COVID was relatively mild, I am reminded, at the same time, by this relatively minor episode, that countless people, including many of you, have been, and are, going through struggles that are far more taxing. In the wider world, we see numbing starvation in East Africa, maybe the worst in 40 years. We see untold fear and suffering in Ukraine, even as there are hopeful signs that the war may be turning. We see Earth's climate taxed beyond the limit by ongoing human disregard for the planet's long-term health.

Closer to home, we see innumerable people shunted to the side by policies that put profit and exclusion ahead of embrace and inclusion. Others suffer from searing illnesses; or they watch spouses and parents and friends succumb to dementia; or they lose people dear to them to death. Teens struggle with ostracism and bullying. So many feel endlessly lonely.

And it's into this world that Christ is born. It's into this world of suffering and loss and starvation and war and death that God takes human form. While we may often wish for a world in which none of this pain existed, and may even pray for a God who would magically remove the suffering that can haunt us, the truth is that such suffering is an unavoidable part of life. And the wonder of Advent and Christmas is that, into the mess of human life, God comes to sit with us and walk with us and laugh with us and cry with us.

My hope for all of us during this season of Christ's coming and birth is that we will find time, even if only a moment every day, to remember and give thanks for the overarching and eternal presence and love of God. This is the God for whom each life is precious, the God who adores you and me, the God who has seen fit to move into our very neighborhood.

And as we give thanks, may we embrace the opportunities we are presented to give back—to offer a meal, to lend a listening ear, to witness for a more just and equitable world. Just as we have been blessed by a God born here to us, so may we vessels of God's love born in, and for the sake of, others. In Christ.



Community Life Collaborative Amps Up

As 2022 draws to a close, the <u>Community Life Collaborative</u> is amping up staffing, structures and collaborations for a promising new year.

The CLC is excited to announce that two recent grant approvals will benefit the CLC making it possible to increase our social media presence and hire a part time Development Director to help expand our reach, our impact and our messaging!

Throughout October, the CLC hosted PRISM conversations and celebrations giving voice to needs and challenges through the PRISM of abilities in collaboration with local organizations. Our culminating Leaf Party brought "unbe-LEAF-able" success with more than 250 families and friends gathering at the Family Life Center (FLC) to play, to connect, and to advocate together with inclusion in mind.

January launches our "**Reclaiming Reflections**" series focusing conversations on destigmatizing addiction and recovery. Economic hardships, educational barriers, and systemic practices can push some folks into downward spirals of addictive habits. Collaborative social justice work can help to destigmatize the disease, connect people to resources for help, and create spaces and communities ready to help folks "reclaim their reflection" and regain personal and social dignity.

While the CLC manages the expenses and operations of the FLC, use of the FLC building and grounds can be coordinated for church programming with church set up. Please contact CLC Executive Director, Peter Bode at ed@communitylifecollaborative.org to coordinate schedules and plans in advance. The CLC is a separate 501(c)3 nonprofit partnering with Federated Church to nurture transformation through collaboration for a just and sustainable world. Within a day or two, he and his wife arrived with 3 or o4 large bins of new socks.

At almost 80 years of age, I tend to hold down my excitement a bit, but the arrival of those socks did give me new hope. The sock bin is once again full, many feet are a bit warmer and there is a sense of goodwill in the air. Thank you.

I will still be around. I will just be doing a bit different balance between those in need and my 25 Grand-children and 5 Great Grandchildren. You are all very special to me and I look forward to continuing to say thank you for all you do.





Antony's attorney wrote yesterday: "I just heard from the Board of Immigration Appeals that they have granted an emergency stay of removal for Antony. He might still be transferred to another jail, but he can't be removed until further order of the Board." Good work, Brian!

Environmental and Creation Justice

What can we all do to help care for the earth as we enter into the holiday season?

Eco-Friendly Holiday Tips

- Eco-Donations Make a donation to an environmental charity instead of meaningless spending this holiday.
- **Thermostat Downtime** Counteract your increased winter electricity bill by turning down the thermostat when you go to bed.
- Keep It Local Do your best to keep food and purchases this holiday season organic, local, and sustainable.
- **Lights** Use LED Christmas lights and save more than 95 percent of energy overtime. Go for mini lights instead of larger lights, and shut them off when you go to bed.
- **Make or Reuse Decorations** Rather than splurging on new Christmas décor, give a DIY or Pinterest project a whirl; or make a tradition out of reusing family and vintage Christmas décor.
- **Trees** Buy a locally farmed Christmas tree, or buy a "Balled" Christmas three and plant it in your yard.
- **Recycled Paper** Wrap your gifts in recycled paper or even newspaper.
- **Reusable Wrap** Use reusable bags as a fun way to wrap gifts. Another cool idea is to wrap gifts in decorative boxes, reusable vessels, or wearable items like scarves.
- **Select Gifts Carefully** Some gifts come in ambiguous containers or boxes and don't need wrapping, others are small enough that they require less paper. Also think about gifts that are not made of plastic or packaged in plastic.
- **Give Digitally** Sending digital cards is an effective way to reduce waste, check people off your gift list, and ensure that your beloved ones will like what they receive. Wrapp.com is another fantastic option— the iPhone app allows users to send digital gifts directly to any friend's Facebook wall.
- **Card Composition** If you choose to send cards, try to be mindful of where the paper is sourced. Look for recycled paper or wildflower-seeded cards, and recycle cards you receive.
- **Use The Web** Send an ECard for the holidays.

Sunday, December 4 at 2PM (lunch 12PM)


