From the Desk of Rev. Wooster...

"In Jesus Christ, the man of Nazareth, our crucified and risen savior, you have come to us and shared our common lot." - from the United Church of Christ Statement of Faith

Dear Friends,

Indeed, Jesus came to us and shared our Common Lot.

Recently in Confirmation class we explored the theology of the incarnation, that Jesus came to us as both a human and divine being, quite a sophisticated topic for people of all ages. Taken from the UCC statement of faith as listed above, this is a core understanding of our faith, that Jesus is both divine and human.

In the season of Lent which is fast approaching (Ash Wednesday falls on Feb. 22nd this year), I encourage you to read through the verses listed below that remind us how our savior came to us with lived experiences not dissimilar from our own. It is a matter of faith and contemplation to explore the concept of the Incarnation, the mystery that the God of the universe took on flesh and lived among us while also being *fully God*.

As we bring our hearts, minds, and bodies into the Lenten season, when we follow Jesus' ministry all the way through his Passion, Crucifixion, and ultimately his Resurrection, it is important to consider that Jesus was born into our human world and experienced all the pain, sorrows, and joys that we do. Each of the scripture verses below remind us that there is no experience as humans that God does not share. There is no place in the experience of our lives where God does not meet us. The divine and human mystery that Jesus was "God among us" is central to our faith. God is among us still. Jesus walks with us still. Let us, together, deepen our awareness of the divine in our midst this Lenten Season.

John 1:1-18 – The Divine became human in Jesus Christ.

Luke 22:63-23:46 - Jesus was physically hurt.

Mark 4:35-38 - Jesus Slept.

Matthew 21:18 – Jesus was hungry.

John 11:28-36 – Jesus wept for a friend.

Mark 6:30-32 - Jesus spent time with his friends.

John 2: 1-11 - Jesus celebrated.

John 2:13-16 – Jesus got angry.

Luke 2: 41-51 – Jesus upset his parents.

Matthew 15: 30-38 – Jesus felt sorry for someone else.

Dreams and Spiritual Growth Women's Retreat

We invite you to join us for a time of spiritual retreat. Set in a contemplative atmosphere, we will consider what God desires for us, and what God may be communicating to us through our dreams. We will look at what dreams are and study a dream from scripture to learn how we might apply such learning to our own dreams. We will also explore the dream as a source of God's ongoing revelation to us, as we seek to live more wholistic lives.

Presenter: Janice Bachman, O.P., is a Dominican Sister of Peace, who is a Jungian Analyst and spiritual director in practice in the Columbus area. For the past 25+ years, Janice has been involved in training spiritual directors and has offered a variety of workshops and retreats on dreams. A key area of interest for her is the convergence of analytical psychology and spirituality, and how the two disciplines and their symbols inform the process of analysis, spiritual development and becoming more whole persons.

Janice is on the summer faculty at Creighton University, Omaha, NE., where she teaches in the Graduate Program in Christian Spirituality. Over the years, one of the courses she has taught is Dreams and Spiritual Growth. She holds a Masters' Degree in Christian Spirituality from Creighton University, a degree in Analytical Psychology from the Ontario Association of Jungian Analysts (Toronto) and an MBA from Xavier University, Cincinnati.



Here are the numbers: as of January 20th:


- We are 91.82% (\$918,231) of the way towards our \$1M goal with 286 households responding to our Generosity 2023 invitation.

Community Life Collaborative to Engage Conversation & Deepen Understanding at the Family Life Center and Beyond

Mark your calendars!

Throughout February and into March, local organizations are partnering with the CLC to bring light to issues of racial equity and jurisprudence. The CLC "Deep Roots Initiative" offers a series of opportunities to engage community conversations at the Family Life Center as well as other locations.

The Gardenview Gallery continues to engage hearts & conversation through art:

Feb. 8-13 Sacred Ally Quilt Ministry "Stitch, Breath, Speak- George Floyd Quilts". (See SJAM description for interfaith worship, vigil, documentary, and public exhibit times for what promises to be a remarkable community experience) in partnership with SJAM, Heartland Conference, Living Water Association, and Chagrin Arts.

February 21st: Power of Harmony "Community Conversation" 7:00pm at the FLC, hybrid event

Hear from the Power of Harmony, a group that uses vocal ensemble singing and positive male role models to demonstrate the values of cooperation and community. Their mission is to reduce recidivism and help change the trajectory of incarcerated youth.

In early March, watch for a "Community Conversation" with South Street Ministries. SSM equips and inspires restoration of community, economy, and faith with a holistic approach to community development elevating community voice and leadership. Join the conversation.

March 11: Hand to Hand Veronica Robinson facilitates a "Community Conversation" 1pm at the FLC A deep dive into some groups that are creating programming around at-risk youth, giving them the intrinsic skills to navigate life and excel as members of society in "Life Skills Through Sports".

March 25: Panel discussion by the "Hell and Back Gang", lunch and music 11am-2pm at the FLC, hybrid event. <u>The Hell and Back Gang</u> is a book written in 2020 about the accounts of seven individuals who have been through the prison system and are now working to give people resources in society (personal, material, employment, etc.) for transitioning out of prison and staying free.

Right after worship, we'll head over to Federated's Family Life Center, where the Sacred Ally Quilt Ministry, a ministry of the New Hampshire Conference of the United Church Christ, is currently in residence. The quilts on display are an opportunity to become aware of projects in the wider UCC, and to reflect on the dialogue about the church's history and role in racial justice.
