From the Desk of Rev. Throckmorton...

Dear Friends,

What a beautiful fullness there is to the month of April in the church. The beginning of April launches Holy Week, starting with Palm/Passion Sunday on April 2. Palm/Passion Sunday itself is a day of wonderful and terrible opposites. We begin with Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem, celebrated with festive palm-waving and loud "Hosannas." How quickly things turn, though, and how precipitous is the fall into rejection, crucifixion, and death. Thrilling in one moment and ominous in the next, Palm/Passion Sunday marks the beginning of that gloomy descent.

That journey continues with the ignominy of death that we mark on Maundy Thursday. Much as we may fear or despise that dismal day, it is also the fulcrum on which Christian faith turns. It marks the reality of our lives, which is that no matter how grand our plans, no matter how successful our triumphs, no matter how glorious our bliss, failure and dissolution and death are never far from us. Failure can overtake us. Discouragement and depression can run us down. And death of our friends, our family, and ourselves will finally put all our vitality to rest. That's it in a stark nutshell.

And miraculously, that's not the end of the story! Jesus rises from the dead! Even in our despair, there is hope. Even in our brokenness, there is healing. Even in our deaths, there is life. Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed! The good news is that we are never abandoned, we are never left to ourselves, we are never simply the product of our worst moments and most debilitating losses. We are children of God to whom are promised restoration and hope. We are citizens of a holy realm blessed with life beyond all our various graves. Whatever losses and deaths you and I are presently experiencing, know that they are not the end of the story. God promises new life to you and to me and to all of us. Thanks be to God!

SABBATICAL

I also want to express my thanks to all of you for the sabbatical you have granted me this spring and summer. The opportunity for two months of rest and restoration is a great gift, and, combined with my customary vacation break, is a blessing I do not take lightly. I so treasure my calling as a pastor. At the same time, the chance to take some extended "sabbath" time to rejuvenate is a gift of the highest order. I will miss you in my time away, and will look forward joyfully to resuming our shared ministry when I return in August.

St. Paul's Outreach

Greetings from St. Paul's Outreach! We've had a great start to 2023! We've rearranged some of our spaces to make them more user friendly for our Church and Outreach programs. Our Drop-In Hospitality on Tuesdays and Thursdays is as busy as ever. It must be our great coffee! We continue to offer hygiene items, ID vouchers, t-shirts, underwear and socks. If you would like to make a donation we are low on deodorant, Q-tips, men's boxer briefs and white t-shirts - all sizes. Tim is still running our Clothing Ministry every Tuesday. People appreciate the opportunity to "shop" for something new especially as the seasons change. Our revamped Food Pantry is also a hit with our customers. They appreciate the choices they have as they shop in the pantry. We are rebuilding our supplies and are now offering meat, dairy and produce items. With the cuts in the extra SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) allotment we anticipate an increase of people needing to use the food pantry. Items we could use include peanut butter, jelly or jam, canned fruit, canned chili, and chicken noodle soup.

We hope to start a Garden Club to grow food to supplement the pantry. St. Paul's Patch community garden is across the street from the church and we plan to grow tomatoes, peppers, and lettuces. If you have a green thumb and would like to help out, let me know! We've also started a Cooking Club at St. Paul's Outreach. Control of your food and diet is one of the first losses people who are experiencing homelessness feel. The Cooking Club will plan, prepare, cook and share a meal with our partner churches and community members. Do you have the gift of cooking you would like to share? Let me know and I will give you the details. My email is <u>paula@stpaulscommunityucc.org</u> if you would like to arrange a drop off of items or have any questions.

We appreciate the sustained support members of Federated Church provide to our Outreach Program at St. Paul's. We hope you will join us as we build our programs that invite people into a transformational relationship with those we are accompanying on their journey.
