

From the Desk of Rev. Wooster...



Song of Songs 2: 11-12
¹¹ for now the winter is past, the rain is over and gone.
¹² The flowers appear on the earth; the time of singing has come, and the voice of the turtle-dove is heard in our land.



"June is Bustin' Out All Over!" This song from the musical Carousel and the scripture passage from the Song of Songs come to my mind as summer beckons to us. Amidst our June worship theme of "Transformational Encounters" the Rodgers and Hammerstein song transforms my soul for at least two reasons: peonies and my grandmother.

My grandmother taught my kindergarten Sunday school class and was devoted to her faith. She played the piano and sang with us; she read me children's Bible stories; she loved to garden and had a stunning hedge of peonies in her yard that burst into bloom in the month of June. Being with her was like a burst of flowers appearing on the earth.

Because of all the above, my grandmother was, and continues to be, a transformational encounter in my life. She showed me what the love of God felt like and looked like just by being herself. The flowers she cultivated in her garden were an extension of her own beauty, and the peonies that now grow in my yard sing her presence to me still.

There is only one problem with peonies. Their blooming season is short. So much so that I wrote a poem about them once. The first line of the poem is "Come back, I beg you!" And the good news is that they do come back. Every year, in the month of June, they come back, and their gargantuan blooms, so fragrant with the sweetness of summer, remind me that the time for singing has come.



Let us sing together the songs of God as summer comes. Whether it be a song that you love from a favorite musical, a hymn that holds special meaning for you, whether it be a birdsong in the air or the gentle music of a rippling stream, may it awaken you to a new recognition that God is near, and that you can count on God's steadfast love. May the songs of God transform you as summer dawns.
