From the Desk of Rev. Hamilton Throckmorton

Dear Friends.

How wonderful it is to be back at Federated after my combination sabbatical/vacation time this summer! As I mentioned during worship in my first Sunday back, my sabbatical was just what I needed. It gave me a chance to rest and rejuvenate-to recharge my batteries by stopping and returning to the well-spring of God's restorative energy. My time away was deeply nourishing.

So first I want to thank you, Federated, for your embrace of sabbaticals for your pastors. To have that chance to be restored by time away is an immense gift, and I am extraordinarily grateful.

Next, I want to fill you in a little on some of the highlights of the summer. (Some of this I shared in worship on August 27.) I was thrilled, early in the summer, to attend my 50th high school reunion in Massachusetts. Of my 152 classmates, 23 had died, so I co-led a memorial service for them. I also offered some reflections before the formal dinner we shared on the Friday night of that weekend. In addition, I had abundant opportunity to connect with classmates I had known well and others I had hardly known at all. I could not have been happier that I went to it.

I also officiated at the wedding of my nephew Ellis to his now-spouse Karlee at a magnificent spot on Penobscot Bay in Maine. The day was picture-perfect, and we all took such joy in their sweet and tender union. They are dear to me, and it was a gift to spend extended time with them. In addition, part of the gift of the wedding

was that it provided an opportunity for Mary's and my children and grandchildren to join us for the week leading up to it.

In August, we celebrated Mary's birthday with a special trip to New River Gorge, America's newest national park, in West Virginia. I didn't tell her we were leaving

until the morning of our departure. Nor did she know that our children and

grandchildren would be there until they showed up on our doorstep. Mary was floored, and we all had a marvelous time. $^{lacktree{k}}$ I also had the chance to read both journals and books. Three of the highlights were

Jonathan Franzen's sprawling and magnificent novel Crossroads, about a minister and his family in the 1970s; Franzen's observations about the church and ministry are astoundingly perceptive, and the story is gripping. I appreciated Saving God from Religion: A Minister's Search for Faith in a Skeptical Age, a book of reflections by UCC minister Robin Meyers, a pastor in Oklahoma City; he reframes theology and the church in a marvelous and accessible and earthy way. Finally, I have been enriched by reading Joan Chittister's gem of a book on aging, The Gift of Years, it's a book to savor in small installments, and one I think many of you would appreciate.

And now I'm excited to be back among you and look forward to a promising fall together. Rally Day will be a thrilling day of new beginnings, complete with lunch, an ice cream truck, and the superb band A.J. and the Woods. Our church leadership and commissions are planning a nourishing and stimulating program of events. There will be much to enliven us and connect us to the God who is always on our pulse. I look forward to connecting with you and to discerning together the shape of our ministry and mission for this new moment. It's all an enormous privilege. May God fill us with Spirit and lead us in the healing and redemptive way.






