### From the Desk of Rev. Hamilton Throckmorton...

Dear Friends,

As we move into March, we move further into the season of Lent. As we travel this Lenten journey, we wend our way into the heart of Christian faith. The story of both the Hebrew Bible and the Christian New Testament is of a piece. In the Hebrew scriptures, the heart of the story is that an Israelite people who have been enslaved in Egypt are led by God to a promised land they could never have imagined or created on their own. And then, centuries later, after the people have been carried off into exile in Babylon, they somehow, against all odds and after many years, are led back to their land. In both the Exodus and the Exile, God has offered a present and a future where none seemed possible.

The New Testament story of Jesus' death and resurrection extends this awesome sense of God's saving presence even further. Now, the power of the Roman Empire is shown to be penultimate. Now, the confining energy of smaller-minded, destructive religious contemporaries is broken down. Now, even death is revealed for the impostor it is. As an Easter hymn puts it, "Tis the spring of souls today; Christ hath burst his prison, and from three days' sleep in death as a sun has risen" ("Come, Ye Faithful. Raise the Strain," v. 2).

Indeed, the hymns we sing at Easter express the magnificence of the day beautifully: "Christ the Lord is risen today, Alleluia!" "I know that my Redeemer lives." "Thine is the glory." "The strife is o'er, the battle done." "He lives." "Alleluia! Sing to Jesus." "Crown him with many crowns." This is our exultant experience of God's decisive resurrecting act.

So while we can never talk with scientific precision about what exactly happens on that first Easter day, we can nonetheless talk with utter confidence about the magnificence of the God who made that day, as well as all the succeeding resurrecting days, possible. And that's because our experience is that no death is too final, no grave too confining, no failure too total, no ending too complete that God can't bring a way out of no way.

May we journey together through this Lenten season and join together when Easter arrives to celebrate the richness and wonder of the God who is our all-in-all.



The problem with race-based medicine | TED Talk

Social justice advocate and law scholar Dorothy Roberts has a precise and powerful message: Race-based medicine is bad medicine. Even today, many doctors still use race as a medical shortcut; they make important



decisions about things like pain tolerance based on a patient's skin color instead of medical observation and measurement. In this searing talk, Roberts lays out the lingering traces of race-based medicine -- and invites us to be a part of ending it.
