## From the Desk of Rev. Hamilton Throckmorton...

Dear Friends,

When I was growing up, I have fond memories of Easter that revolve around spring and Easter eggs and chocolate bunnies. I especially remember dying the eggs, using a tin egg holder with which to dip the eggs in the dye, and then searching for the hidden eggs that my parents had hidden around our yard. With Easter there came such a fun and hopeful air.

It was not until I had gotten much older that I came to appreciate some of the depths of that resurrection day. I came to have a deeper sense that, no matter what happened in my life and in our life together, God was ever-present. I came to trust much more that, even in the difficult times, grace is the water in which we swim. I came to see that God's love is not bound even by the seeming finality of death, and to see that we are held close to the bosom of God even, and we should say especially, when hope seems to have dried up.

One of the helpful adaptations the church has made over the years is that we now see Easter not as a single day but as a season. When I was a child, Easter was "one and done." Once the brass had concluded and the affirmations that Christ had risen petered out, we were back to the ordinary days of the year. In the last generation or two, though, the church has come to acknowledge that this central moment of Christian life deserved more than a single day. So now we celebrate Easter as a season of seven weeks. All of April and much of May this year celebrates the richness of resurrection life. Now the day of Pentecost on May 19 ends the season of Easter.

I invite us all to be especially mindful, during this special season, of God's holy love animating each moment. No tomb is too tight, no failure too all-encompassing, no death too final that God's magnificence and joy cannot break through the shadows to offer a candle of hope and an indefatigable ray of light.

May we live in that light and pass it to each other and to the wider world as we bask in that

resurrection joy.

Dear Beloved Congregation,

Joy and God's love be with you. As we gather in the warmth of our faith community, I am filled with immense gratitude for our recent Annual Meeting. Your presence, dedication, and willingness to engage together in important discussions shows the true power of our Federated Congregation.

Our Annual Meeting was more than just a formality; it was a sacred space where we came together as a family. We discussed matters close to our hearts, tough matters like our budget, our use of funds, and the decision around the Family Life Center. Your thoughtful participation and commitment to transparency were evident, and I am thankful for each voice that contributed to our collective discernment.

The courage and love displayed during the FLC discussions was inspiring. It was evident that the congregation fully supports the CLC and all they do for the community and the church's activities as part of that community. First, we'll move forward quickly with a lease arrangement through the Finance & Properties Committee, creating a new lease agreement that enables the future. Second, we'll communicate our dedication to a relationship, with this message along with others through the year. Third, we'll have one of the CLC leaders serve as a member of Church Council, ensuring programs can align and any gaps close before they form. And lastly, we'll look for activities that we can plan to leverage the FLC property. We'll start with the May Blossom Time Festival Worship Service on Sunday May 26, 2024, a day the church is normally closed, to host our service at the FLC. That'll be one of many activities that we do going forward.

Our fellowship continues to be a source of spiritual nourishment. Whether we gather in person or virtually, our praises rise as one. Our love of God and of each other binds us together. Thank you for showing up and for allowing God's presence to envelop us. As we move forward, let us hold onto the spirit of unity, compassion, and hope that defines our congregation. May we continue to seek God's guidance, support one another, and extend grace to those around us as we work to grow and serve.



# **Generosity Corner**

Dear SPIFFY Middle School Youth Group:

Thank you so very much for your generosity and compassion for the animals in our care. Your support for the animals and mission of Rescue Village is greatly appreciated. Your in-kind donation of dog care items via Amazon Wish List is making a world of difference.

We are so glad to here that you enjoyed the tour and we are so grateful for your service project work!

Rescue Village is a community center for animals and their people. We are about keeping you and your pets together. We offer support for each animal from the moment they arrive at here until well after they are adopted and placed in a permanent home, including behavioral training and advice, and more. Rescue Village is a place where vulnerable dogs, cats, horses, donkeys, pigs, chickens, guinea pigs and even alpaca (to name a few) are given shelter, veterinary care, training, and a dedicated team of people who work 365 days a year to find them a permanent home with a caring family.

Rescue Village is a shelter that also helps reduce the number of kittens born to feral, stray, and community cats through its Trap, Neuter, and Return (TNR) effort that is aided by a dedicated team of cat-loving volunteers. In Geauga County, Rescue Village also investigates cases, educates people about, and if necessary, enforces Ohio's humane laws – protecting the helpless from abuse.

This important work is done at a 19,000 square foot facility that sits in a park-like setting on 14 acres of wooded land in the heart of Cleveland's eastern communities. The dogs have paths in the woods where volunteers take them for walks. A barn and paddock provide shelter to barn animals in need. And, volunteers foster Rescue Village's animals in their homes, creating a virtual shelter on couches and in barns across the area – reducing the stress of shelter life for the animals and in turn helping us get them adopted sooner.

All of this is made possible by donors like you. Thank you from the bottom of our hearts.




