Communion Prayer

One: God is with us.

All: We are not alone.

One: Christ is present here.

One: Let us give thanks to God . . .

All: Who creates for us a spiritual home.

One: You, Creating God, formed us in our mothers' wombs in your image where, held inside your arms of love, we knew we were home.

All: You sent prophets to call to us, reminding us that you are always at hand.

Their voices cry out across history, saying, "Do not despair! The One who created you has never forgotten you and will always welcome you home."

One: Even in times of loneliness and nothingness, when we feel most vulnerable and forgotten, God's word comes to us in quiet shouts, in keen affirmations, and in calls upon our souls to magnify God. And so, with voices gentle and loud, timid and strong, we declare to the universe:
