Dear Friends,

Although I am not a person who thinks that the world is going to change simply because we have turned the calendar to a new year, there is something about the possibilities of new beginnings that I find exciting! As we begin this new year at Federated, there will new beginnings and joyful surprises as the work of calling a new pastor begins in earnest.

In addition to the work of the search committee, I have recently formed a transition team who will work with me over the remainder of my time with you. I am pleased to share that Beth Rutkowski, Adam Graves, Padi Joseph, Robin Harbage and Peggie Jo Shinagawa will help to prepare the congregation for the arrival of the new pastor.

While the search committee's focus is on creating a church profile to advertise the opening and then interview and select a candidate, the transition team will work to prepare the congregation for the arrival of the new pastor. We will be considering the history of the congregation, identifying its greatest achievements and moments of great pride while also identifying any unresolved conflicts. We will prayerfully consider who God is calling the church to be in this time and ensuring that the infrastructure is in place when the new pastor arrives so that you can thrive.

As you know, the search committee has planned a series of listening sessions this month to hear what you are seeking in a new pastor. Members of the transition team will also be present at each session, carefully listening to what you share. We will then compile what we learn and use it in our preparation work.

Change can often be hard for people, but my prayer is that we will be able to embrace Henri Nouwen's wise words and celebrate as a surprise the opportunity to open a new place in our hearts to welcome a new pastor and celebrate our shared humanity.


January-February Book Study

Through interactive and hands-on activities, you'll learn how to effectively engage in peaceful direct actions, and advocate for policies that protect both people and the planet.

Rooted in the principles of nonviolence, this training emphasizes the power of collective action, community-building, and peaceful resistance as tools for creating lasting social change. Whether you're new to organizing or looking to **deepen your impact**, this training will provide you with the knowledge and confidence to be a catalyst for positive environmental and social transformation. Joe Worthy, of **Spark Acumen**, will lead the workshop. He is the Director of Education at the Albert Einstein Institution, where he coaches young nonviolent activists in leadership skills and develops the project planning capacities of the Institution. Joe is a Community Organizer by trade, building and leading community organizing projects that have ended Zero Tolerance Policies in Boston and overhauled Cleveland's Citizens Review board in response to the police homicide of Tamir Rice and Tanisha Anderson. Previously, he was the National Organizer of the Children's Defense Fund, working to end the Cradle to Prison Pipeline. Additionally, Joe was a Community Fellow at the Harvard Kennedy School where he further developed his skills as an organizer and political scientist. **Spark Acumen– We bring together purpose and expertise to drive revolutionary change.**


