#### From the Desk of Operations...

#### **Welcome Oliver Mason!**

Please offer a warm welcome to our new **Director of Youth & Family Ministries** Oliver Mason.

#### A bit about this new position

Upon the retirement of Rev. Betsy Wooster, the Church Council determined that a full-time position focused on our children, youth and families was the right direction for the church based on the congregation listening sessions, future goals, and current momentum. They also determined that it did not need to be a clergy position, and further, they advised to begin the search right away instead of waiting for the new Senior Pastor to be installed.

So beginning in May of this year, a search committee of 7, led by Karen Wright, reviewed numerous applications and interviewed several candidates. The selection of Oliver Mason for this position was unanimously approved by the search committee and the Church Council.

#### A bit about Oliver Mason

Oliver moved to Chagrin Falls from the United Kingdom back in 2000 and spent his formative years roaming the halls of Federated Church and taking part in the amazing youth programs. An Undergraduate Degree in engineering, a Master's Degree in teaching, and plenty of time on the soccer pitch, has landed him back in these halls he used to be so familiar with. Now, he is excited to take on this new role to grow the Youth and Family Ministries with the help of the wonderful Federated Community.

Oliver is an explorer. Nothing is beyond the realm of his curiosity and he continually strives to learn and expand the horizon of his world. You can find him amongst the shelves of Fireside Bookshop, underneath the trees at the Whitesburg Preserve, or lunching at one of the delicious Chagrin establishments.

You will have many opportunities to get to know him, and we will formally introduce him on Rally Day, September 7. It should be a wonderful time of celebration!

#### Search Committee Progress Report

Beginning this past winter, the Senior Pastor Search Committee began our work together. We started with congregational listening sessions and an online survey to understand what we were all looking for in the next Senior Pastor. We then used that information to create our UCC church profile and officially posted the opening in the spring.

The information you shared was an important guide in developing the key attributes that our candidate needed to be a good fit for the Senior Pastor role at Federated. We have set the bar high and made sure that it is in line with your vision for the church.

We've had over 19 people apply for the position and we've been busy this summer screening the applicants, doing virtual and in-person interviews, and watching lots of sermons! We've had some good candidates, and we've had some that are not ready to lead a church like Federated.

Regarding the timing, it is possible that we could have our new senior pastor by the end of the year, but it's more likely that it will extend into next year. Timing is very hard to predict with a process like this. We are blessed to have Vicki's strong leadership during this interim period, and fortunate to have flexibility over the length of time she will be able to be with us. We are also blessed to have an engaged and fantastic staff to ensure we don't miss a beat during this time.

We are grateful to this congregation for entrusting the members of the search committee to do this important work. Our process continues, and I assure you that we are focused on finding the <u>right</u> person to lead our wonderful church for the years ahead.



# GENEROSITY Spotlight MAREN KOEPF



As a child, my parents expected me to place a portion of my allowance in the offering basket every Sunday. So for years, when committing a pledge to the church as an adult, my routine was to consider the year's budget and pledge a portion of my discretionary funds (if I had any), to the church.

Then I met Pam at the grocery store and what she did blew my mind. She was filling one grocery cart for her family and a second one equally with nonperishable goods to give to the food bank. Holy cow! While I was selecting out the unwanted cans from my pantry of beets and beans as token contributions, Pam and her family were filling carts full of favorites to give away. I came to realize I was living out of a scarcity mindset, and holding back based on a sense that there wouldn't be enough. I was not living through the mindset of abundance, trusting that God will supply all that I need.

Now, I pledge first, budget later: choosing "first fruits" rather than the crumbs, as an expression of gratitude and acknowledgement that ALL things come from God. I see pledging as an intentional stretch beyond what I perceive I "need", pushing me out of my comfort zone and my attachment to worldly things.

Federated Church has added to the richness of my life in more ways than I can ever repay. I used to rely on others, those richer and living more lavishly than "just a school teacher and a carpenter" to give the real pledges to the church. Now I give as a spiritual practice of trust in God, and my life is enriched.

News from this summer's Book Study and Movie Night... in an effort to live into the SJAM Mission Statement, we look into ways we can expand our understanding of conflicts and injustices around the world as well as in our own back yard, Specifically, this summer, SJAM had a four session Book Study of <u>De-Colonizing Palestine</u> and then viewed the movie Where Olive Trees Weep. (Below is a summary from our SJAM Facilitators...

We had a wonderful and diverse crowd of over 100 come to the screening of our SJAM film. Following the film, we had a panel consisting of speakers from Jewish Voices for Peace, as well as familiar faces of Palestinian Muslims who had also provided context and individual experiences through our dynamic book discussion group. We came to understand how supporting Palestine and peace is not anti-Semitic.

Our book's author of De-Colonizing Palestine, and one speaker, not pictured, were from a Palestinian Christian perspective.

Our book group was from Federated as well as communities as far away as Kent, Hudson, and Ashtabula. We think the general consensus was new perspectives, heightened appreciation and a call to action to address the current humanitarian crisis.

We glimpsed how the Bible can be interpreted from extremes like eliminating an entire people to the side of extending God's mercy and justice to those without privilege.

Some were able to attend a zoom follow up to the book sessions, with Peter Makari, who serves as the UCC Representative to a council of churches of Europe and the Middle East. It was informative and included a short video of the author, Mitri Raheb.

The UCC has now formally declared this crisis in Palestine as a Genocide, and we discussed suggested action steps we can take.

A few of those included

- 1. Making phone calls, using the free app, 5calls.org
- 2. Consumer boycotts of companies selling arms to Israel
- 3. Schedule meetings during Congressional recess with our U.S. Senator and Representative.

### As we slowly make the transition to electric vehicles, we can use less gas in the vehicles we drive now.

- Drive within speed limits: it's more efficient (gas mileage declines significantly above 60 MPH) and it helps save the lives of people and animals.
- Drive smoothly: no sudden acceleration or braking. Predictive driving helps with this.

Aggressive driving can reduce fuel efficiency by up to 33% on highways.

- Avoid excess "warming up" or idling. It's better to turn off engine vs. idling for one minute or more, when practical (e.g., drive-thru.)
- Maintain vehicle according to owner's manual (especially oil and filter changes, tire inflation, and tuneups.)
- Carry less stuff: each added 50 lbs of cargo weight = 1% reduction in MPG.
- Combine trips, and avoid heavy traffic when possible.
- Use A/C wisely: it uses 20% more fuel on average.

Minimize use below 40 MPH, but use on freeways to reduce the wind resistance of open windows.

- Use cruise control when possible, except when going uphill.
- Make fuel efficiency one of the top considerations when buying your next vehicle.






