

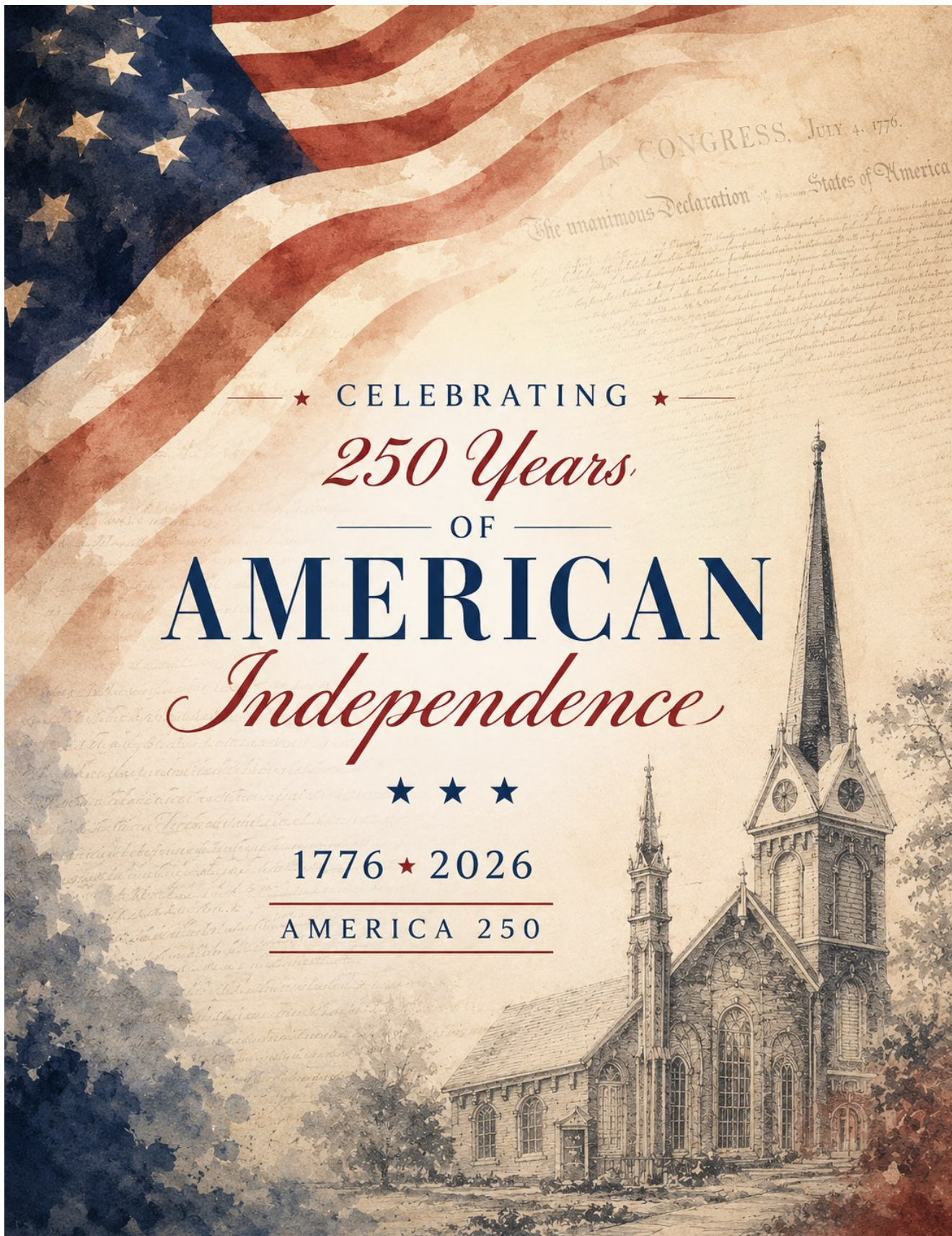

# From the Desk of Pastor Michael...

## What Kind of Place Are We Becoming?

One of the questions that has shaped my ministry over the years is surprisingly simple: What kind of place are we becoming?

Not simply, *What do we believe?* Or, *What programs do we offer?* But what kind of community is taking shape among us? When someone walks through our doors, what do they experience? When a child grows up in this church, what kind of faith is being formed? When our neighbors think about Federated, what comes to mind?

You may have noticed my absence on Father's Day Weekend. I had the privilege of presenting a paper at the annual meeting of the American Society of Missiology in Notre Dame, Indiana. (Missiology is the study of how the Church participates in God's mission in the world.) I was invited to share my research on the theology of place—asking how the places we inhabit shape our faithfulness as followers of Christ.

As I shared my work, I realized that the questions I was bringing to that conversation are the very questions we are living together here at Federated.

Christians often speak about mission as something that happens when we are "sent." There is truth in that. But I have become convinced that...

Before we ask where God is sending us, we should first ask what kind of place God is forming us to be.

When we ask that question, so many of our ministries begin to connect. Hospitality is about the kind of place we become for a visitor. Christian education is about the kind of place we become for our children. Caring for our neighbors is about the kind of place we become within our community. Even the way we care for place is part of our witness. Mission is not only about somewhere else. It begins in the life we cultivate together here.

Scripture is full of places: a garden, a wilderness, a promised land, a home in exile, a table, a village, a city, and finally a holy city where God dwells among humanity. Over and over, God does not simply call individuals. God forms a people and gives them a way of inhabiting the world together.

Every conversation about welcoming a visitor, teaching a child, caring for a neighbor, tending these beautiful places of ours, or creating a church where people are safe, known, and loved is really the same conversation. In the end, all of these are ways of asking the same question: What kind of place are we becoming?

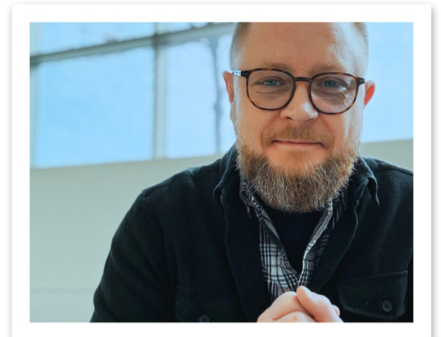
I don't pretend to have all the answers. But I do believe that asking the right question changes everything. My hope is that, together, Federated will become a place where the love of Christ is not only proclaimed but experienced—where our life together bears witness to the good news we share.

Thank you for allowing me to represent our congregation in that wider conversation. More importantly, thank you for being part of the conversation that matters most: the one we are living together every day.

May we continue to ask, together: What kind of place are we becoming?

If *Theo of Golden* touches your imagination, stirs your spirit, or leaves you thinking long after the final page, you are warmly invited to an evening of conversation and reflection.

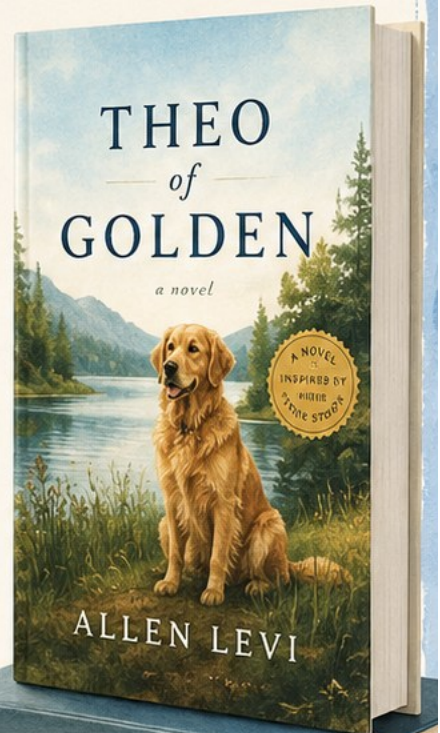

# Healing Divisions

## *with Family and Friends*



**Starting in July** there will be a new resource available to our Federated community. Dr. Bill Shaul and Pastor Susi Kawolics will offer individual or small group coaching for folks struggling with polarization and divisiveness within families or between friends.



The growing estrangement within family and friend groups is no longer simply due to differences in political positions or cultural issues but there are often associated intense emotions—anger, distrust, and contempt. Many believe this polarization represents a greater threat to the fabric of our country than any specific issue.



Bill and Susi will make themselves available to individuals or small groups for free confidential assistance with practical skills on how to bridge these divides. The specific skills are those developed by **Braver Angels**, a National non-partisan, grassroots organization that offers multiple ways of bridging divides, seeking to de-polarize our communities.



We recognize that each divisive circumstance is unique with a history and personalities that require a tailored approach. Sessions will not be about changing anyone's mind on any given position or how to win arguments. The focus will be on developing listening and communication skills, especially when we get emotionally triggered by what someone close to us has said. The purpose will be to re-build relationships and to foster stronger connections with those we care about most.



**Throughout the month of July** there will be an information table in Fellowship Hall **each Sunday after church** where Bill or Susi can answer questions or folks can sign up to participate.

# Mission & Service

Federated Church has had a longstanding relationship with the local Chagrin Falls Park Community Center (CFPCC) nonprofit in Bainbridge.



Members of your Mission & Service Commission, as well as Sunny Doxey and Pastor Michael, recently attended a site visit at the Community Center. Our tour included highlights of their programs, including:

- An after-school tutor program
- Summer Camp - Each summer roughly 40 community children attend.
  - This summer they're also conducting a week-long STEAM camp
- A PreSchool - At the request of the Kenston Board of Education, the Center has opened up this program to help prepare their children for Kindergarten.
- The Share It Shop where residents can choose donated clothing.
- A Foodbank, open 5 days/week, where Geauga County residents can come 2 times/month.



## Mission & Service



- Historically, the Center has been one of the recipients of our Thanksgiving In-gathering, providing turkeys and Thanksgiving meal ingredients to their community families.

As one of our 3 primary Mission Partners, the Center has provided our congregation with many ways to make a difference in the lives of our community. It is our wish that over the next few months the Mission & Service Commission, along with Marty Culbertson, can work in partnership with the CFPCC to discover a hands-on project and/or program that will amplify our relationship. 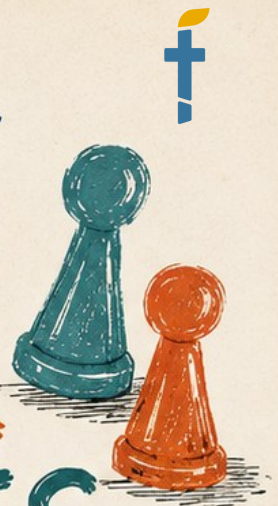

Have you considered that your digital clutter—files no longer needed that are just taking up space—have an environmental cost? All those photos, videos, programs, apps, documents, emails, songs, games, and notifications require data centers for processing and storage.

Here are some suggestions on how to do a “digital declutter:”

- Backup your device, including all important files, photos, etc.
- Unsubscribe to email you don't want, need, or use
- Set up a spam filter, so junk is caught and deleted
- Use email folders to keep only what you really need
- Clear your desktop or Home Screen, using folders to organize
- Uninstall unused programs or apps
- Delete browser bookmarks you no longer use
- Delete unneeded files
- Delete downloads and temporary files
- Sort photos and keep only the ones that matter to you
- Unfollow social media accounts that don't enhance your life
- Delete old, unused contacts
- Clean out old notes and text threads

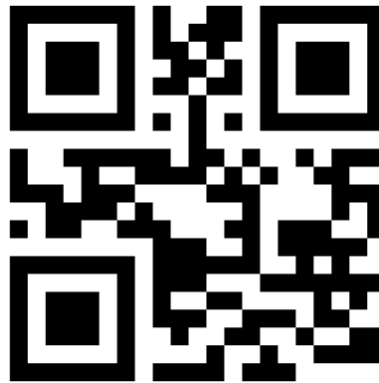
